WASHINGTON HIGH SCHOOL and TEACHERS • RUSTON, LOUISIANA 1924 - 1925

History

In 1921, Ira A. Lewis came to Ruston and started teaching school in an old dilapidated building situated on the right side of the Rock Island Railroad. The school had a session of six months with three full paid teachers and seven grades.

During the summer of 1924, Mr. Lewis returned to school at Tuskegee Institute in Alabama. When he returned home, he found a new building well on the way for use.

On October 14, 1924, the Lincoln Parish School Board initiated a program of improvement for Negro secondary schools. Washington High School (Lincoln High School) was built.

On October 14, 1936, Mr. Ira Andrew Lewis, principal and founder of Lincoln High School, passed away.

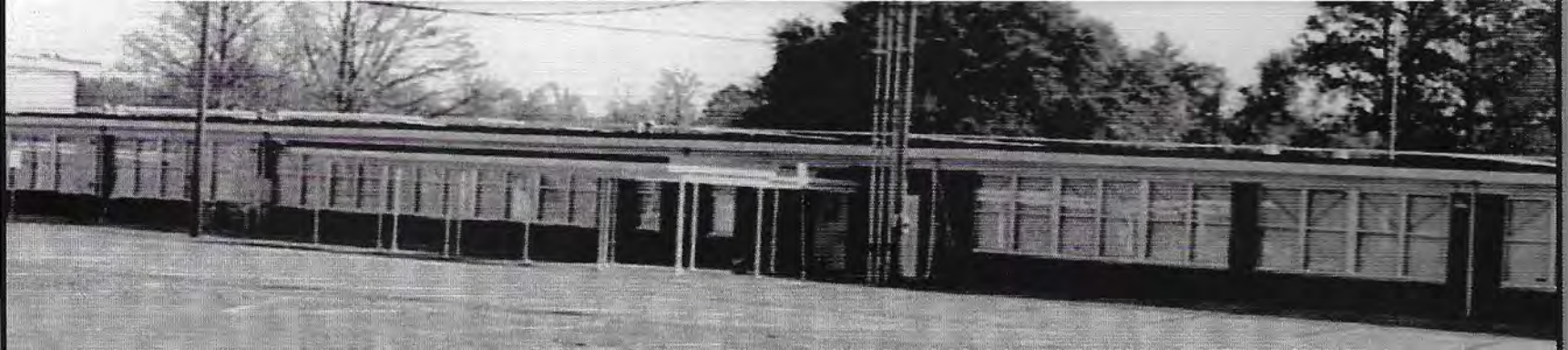
Dr. J. K. Haynes, a teacher and coach at Lincoln High School since 1931, became principal in 1936 and served until 1949. Great progress was made under poor conditions.

Following Mr. Haynes's tenure as principal, Mr. J. H. Owens, Mr. Eddie Davenport, Mr. Aubrey Land, and Mr. Alonzo Davis served as principals, and the school continued to progress.

Lincoln High School recognized the great importance for opportunities in deepening and enriching the physical, spiritual, and intellectual life of its students.

Lincoln High School's doors closed in June 1970, as a result of the "Consent Decree."

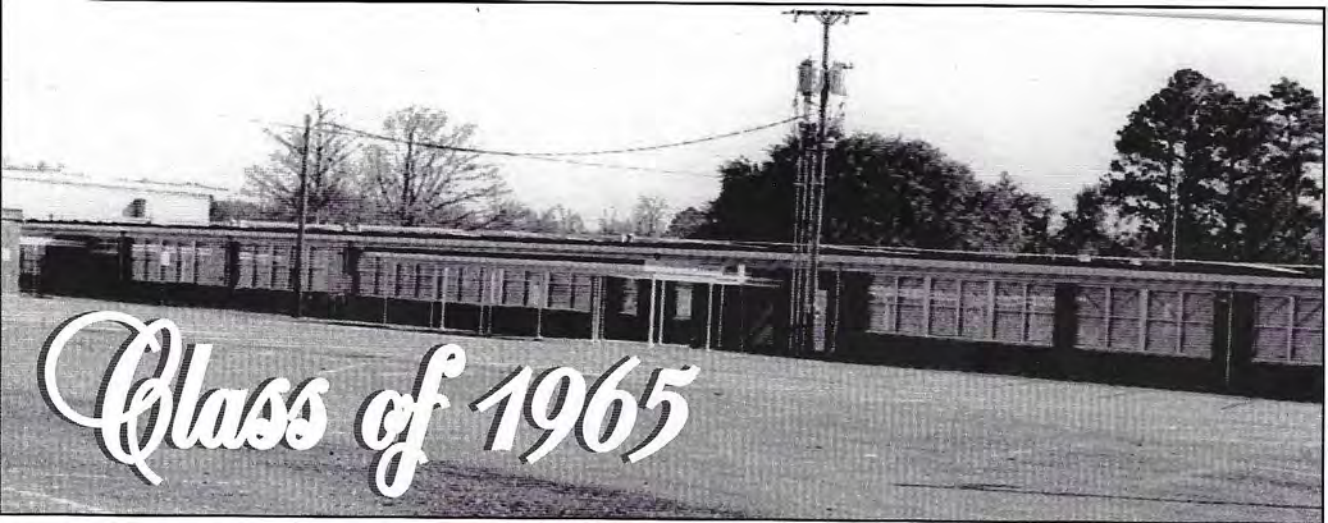
The buildings still stand but are now the Lincoln Parish Learning Center and Paul E. Slaton Head Start Center.
