

Relative to the History of Black Schools in Vidalia, Louisiana

The following history was given through several verbal accounts, to the best recollection of those supplying information:

The name Concord High School is rooted within the former Concordia Parish Training School. The name change took place after the 1968-1969 school term. Concordia Parish Training School in the early 1930's accommodated only grades first through fifth. Later during this era, however, grades six through twelve were added. Even though the grade levels had increased to twelfth grade, students were able to get a certificate to teach after eighth grade.
