The staff, with the senior class of '51, sincerely hope that this, the first edition of the "CRUSADER", will provide you with a record of the most important events and activities of the past year.

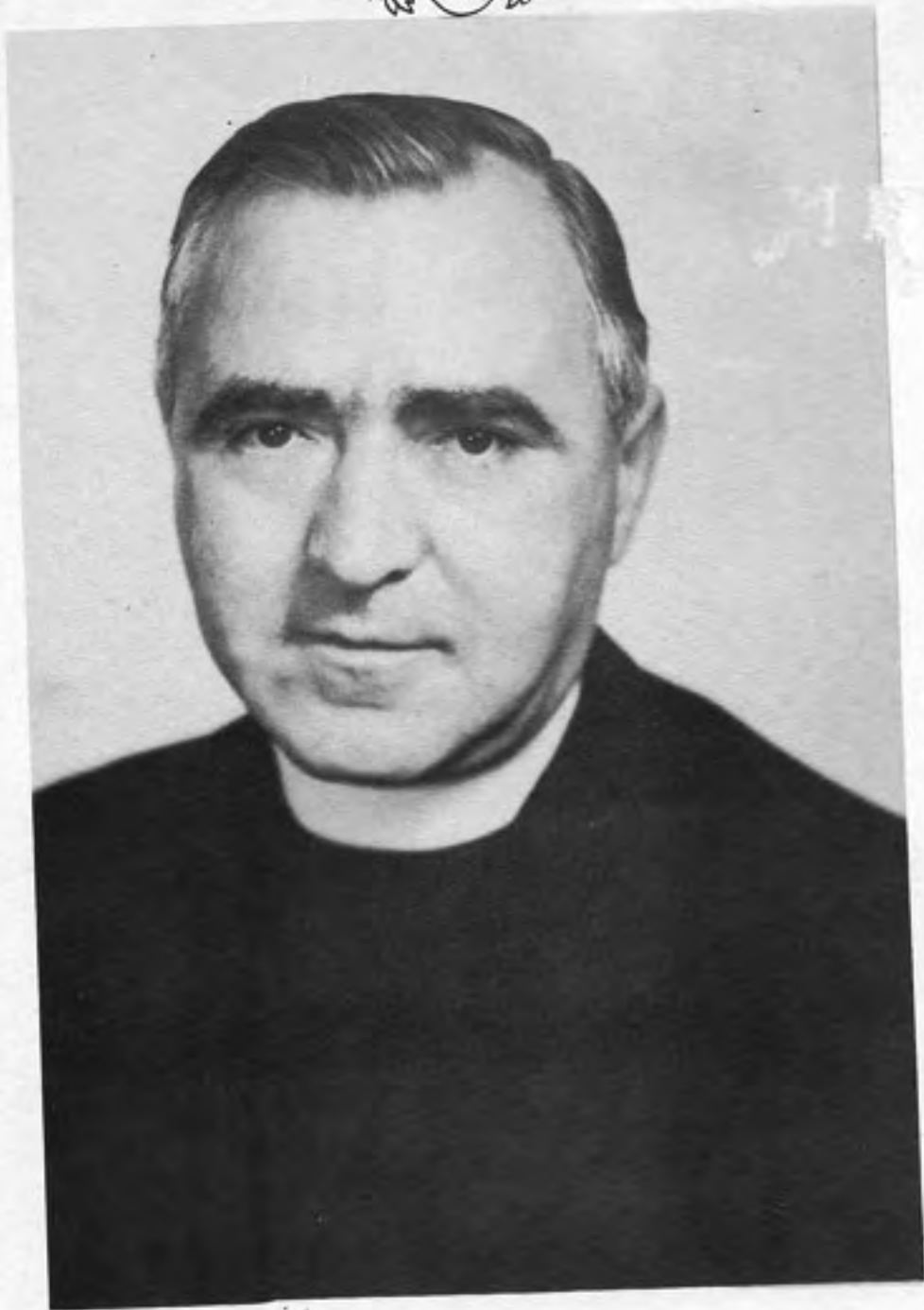

Class History

In the fall of 1947, an enthusiastic group of 35 green "freshies" entered a new life -- the life of a high school student. We were put through many ordeals by the seniors who had the privilege of initiating us, but we proved to be good sports and within a week it was all over and we were warmly welcomed as fellow classmates. Sister Marie Celine, our Home Room teacher, introduced us to the "toughie" of that year, Latin. This subject almost proved our undoing at the outset, but with the able tutorship of Sister and a good deal of hard work in grappling with declensions and verb endings we soon steered into calm waters on the apparently bottomless sea of learning.

Soon a year had passed and we found ourselves bearing the dignified title of Sophomores. We were now a little older and wiser, and took pleasure in looking down on the in-coming "greenies". Sister M. Hubert, our Home Room teacher, instilled in us the true value of reading good books and making use of our library. It was during this year our class entertained the high school with a little program entitled "Know Your Books and Authors". Our hitherto concealed talents soon gained recognition. Some of us excelled in basketball, while others were gifted in dramatics and music. One of the most enjoyable occasions of the year was our trip to Crowley to attend the musical festival, where we had the honor of having one of our classmates rate among the highest in soprano solos. It was during this year that Jesse James joined us.

September 1949 found us a group of eager energetic Juniors, considerably decreased for only twenty of the original group returned. Many of the boys who dropped out joined in our country's defense, while the girls who left settled down to married life and housekeeping.

The biggest interest of this year was the erection of our new high school and gymnasium. Everyone worked tirelessly toward its completion. We gave various socials to raise funds for this purpose chief of which were our "Country Fair" and the "Texas Hoe-Down". Both of these were tremendous successes, socially and financially. Great was our joy when we returned after Christmas holidays to find our dream had materialized. The gym and high school were completed and almost ready for use!

Among the activities and achievements to which we shall always point with pride and that will long be remembered, was our Junior-Senior Prom, the first in our new gym. It

was indeed the most gala attraction ever given or seen in our Alma Mater. It was during our Junior year that our Basketball teams distinguished themselves; the boys by capturing the honors of Champions of the Third Annual Catholic Basketball Tournament, and Runners-up in the District Tournament. The girls were victors in their Division of the Catholic Tournament and gained the title of Runners-up. We were proud to have some of our class members take part in the "Gypsy Troubadour" one of the most successful performances ever to be presented at Sacred Heart.

September 11, 1950 marks the beginning of our Senior year, the year which had been the object of our dreams and hopes for years. At last we were to be those "privileged creatures" - the Seniors.

Many were the surprises awaiting us, chief of which was an entirely new faculty. We found ourselves meeting Mother Mary Frances, Principal of the school and our Home Room teacher, Sister Mary Guadalupe, our French teacher, Sister Mary Bernadette, who was to instruct us in Chemistry and English, Sister Mary George, the Freshman Class teacher, and Mr. Julius Derbigny, our Coach and Physical Education Instructor. After a couple of weeks everyone was acquainted, so we settled down to the regular school routine. We had the pleasure of welcoming another student to our class, Everett Queen, which brought our enrollment to twenty-two. The highlight of our Senior year was the dedication of our new high school and gymnasium which took place on Sunday, November 12th. It was a thrilling occasion and one which will be long remembered.

Early in January, we received our long-awaited and much-prized treasures -- our class rings. They were presented to us by our Pastor, Rev. Clement A. Roach. Father delivered an impressive and inspiring talk on the significance of a class ring. To us, they are the symbols of our loyalty and unswerving devotion to our Alma Mater.

Homecoming game was once again here, and this year it exceeded those of all previous years, by drawing the largest crowd of spectators ever witnessed in past years. A member of our class, Miss Catherine Lede, had the honor of reigning as Homecoming Queen.

As event follows event, we realize that our school days at Sacred Heart are fast drawing to a close. For many of us it may be the last step toward scholastic achievement, for others it is only the foundation for higher learning. Regardless of which path we may choose, we go forth from our Alma Mater well fortified with "Christ Our Pilot" leading the way.

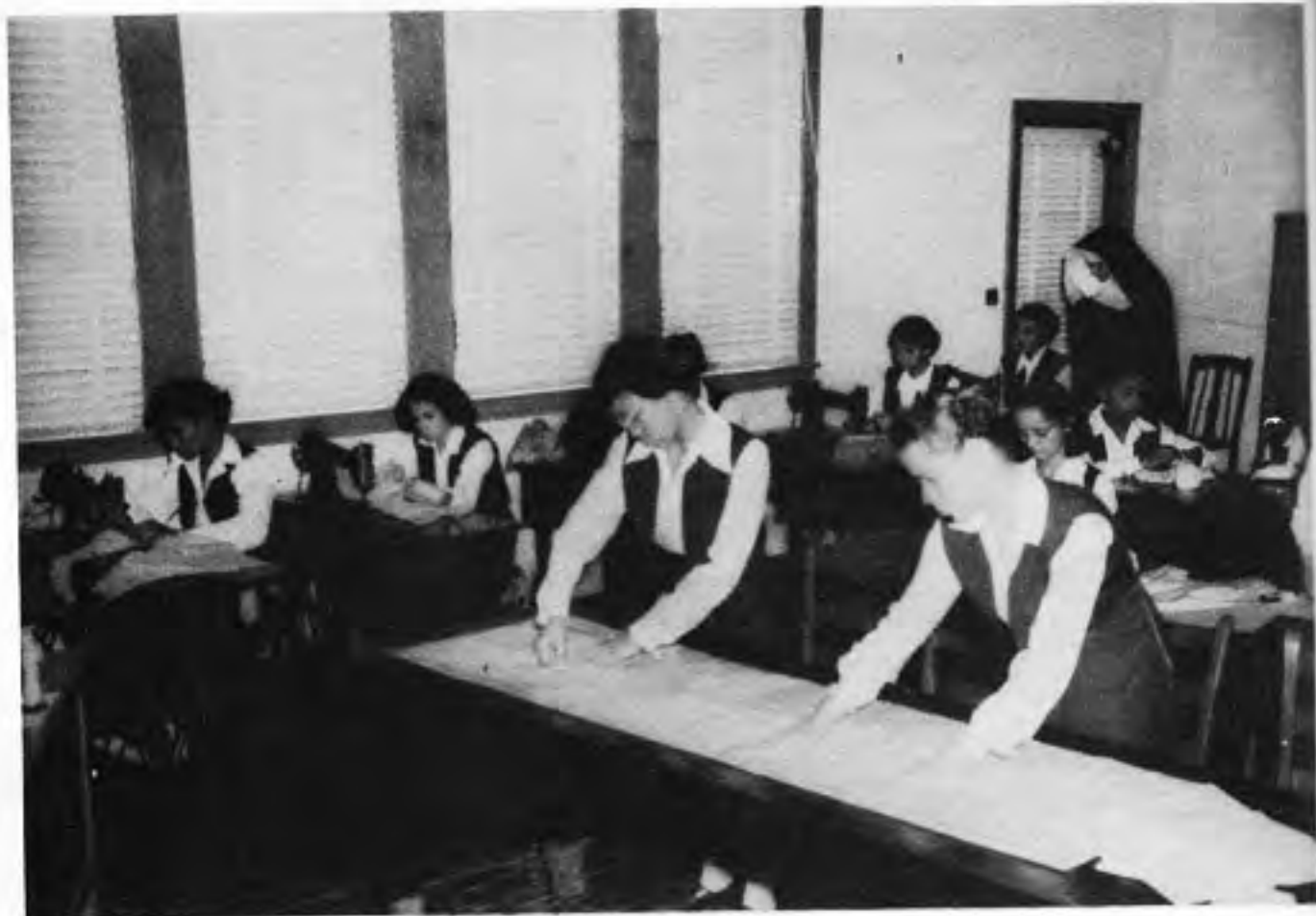

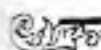

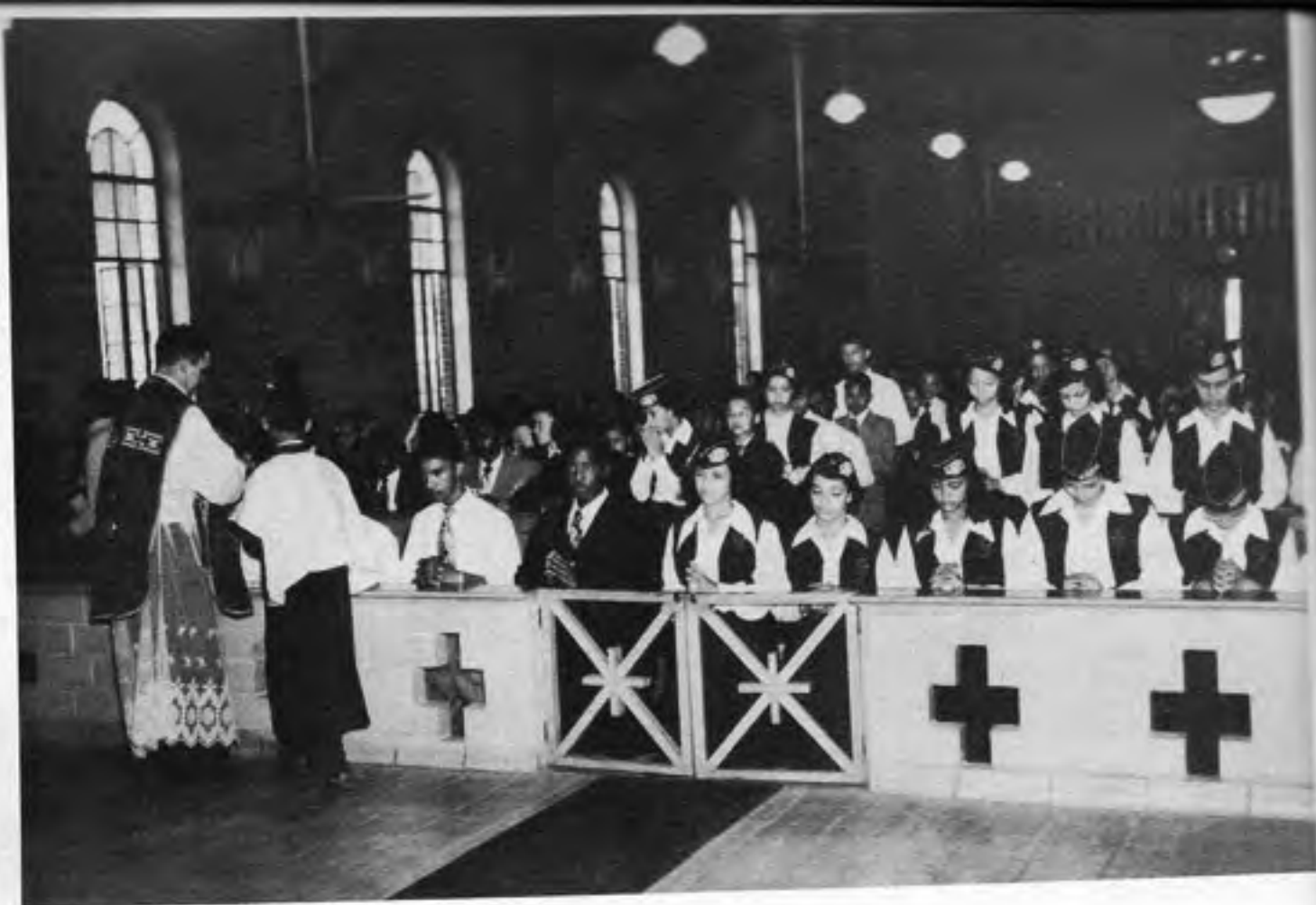
