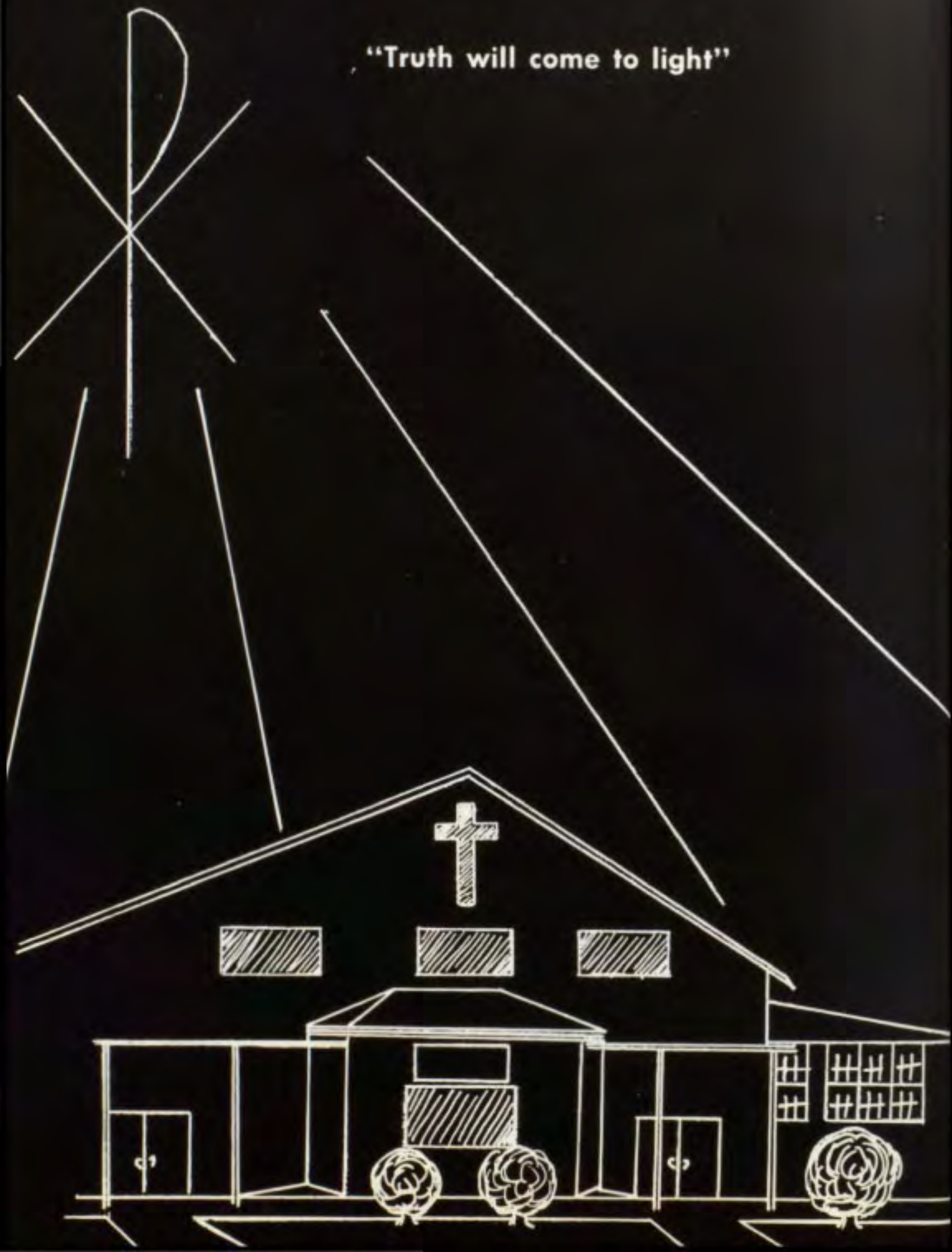

Vikings win Catholic meet

CROWLEY — Sacred Heart High School of Lake Charles has only 74 students and is facing closure at the end of the current school year but the Vikings appear bent on ending their career in a blaze of glory.

They won the annual Lafayette Diocese All-Catholic basketball tournament here Sunday, clipping St. Michael of Crowley in the title game, 66-58.

AIC of Opelousas captured third place in the tournament by edging another Lake Charles entry, the Landry Tigers, 75-62.

Sacred Heart ran its overall record to 17-3, winning 14 of 15 games in the tournament. The Vikings opened with a 79-62 triumph over Holy Rosary of Lafayette Friday and followed up Saturday with an 82-71 decision over Cathedral of Lafayette and a 68-54 victory over AIC to gain the finals.

The Vikings put four players in double figures in the title game, with Anthony Gardner leading the way with 23 points. Clinton Fobbs added 14, John Parehe has 13 and Kenneth Gullioy 10.

Calvin Hargrave paced St. Michael with 18 points, Jerry Trouille had 17 and Jimmy Thibodeaux contributed 11 points.

Dane and Daryl D'Avy led AIC past Landry with 29 points each and had help from Jim Genovese with 16 and Leonard Savoy with 10.

Mike Lynch was Landry's top producer, setting 18 points, and three other Tigers joined him in double-digits. Mike Courville had 12 points, Tommy Tuminello hit for 11 and Mike Papina added 10.

Sacred Heart will bid for victory No. 18 Tuesday night when the Vikings host W. O. Boston.

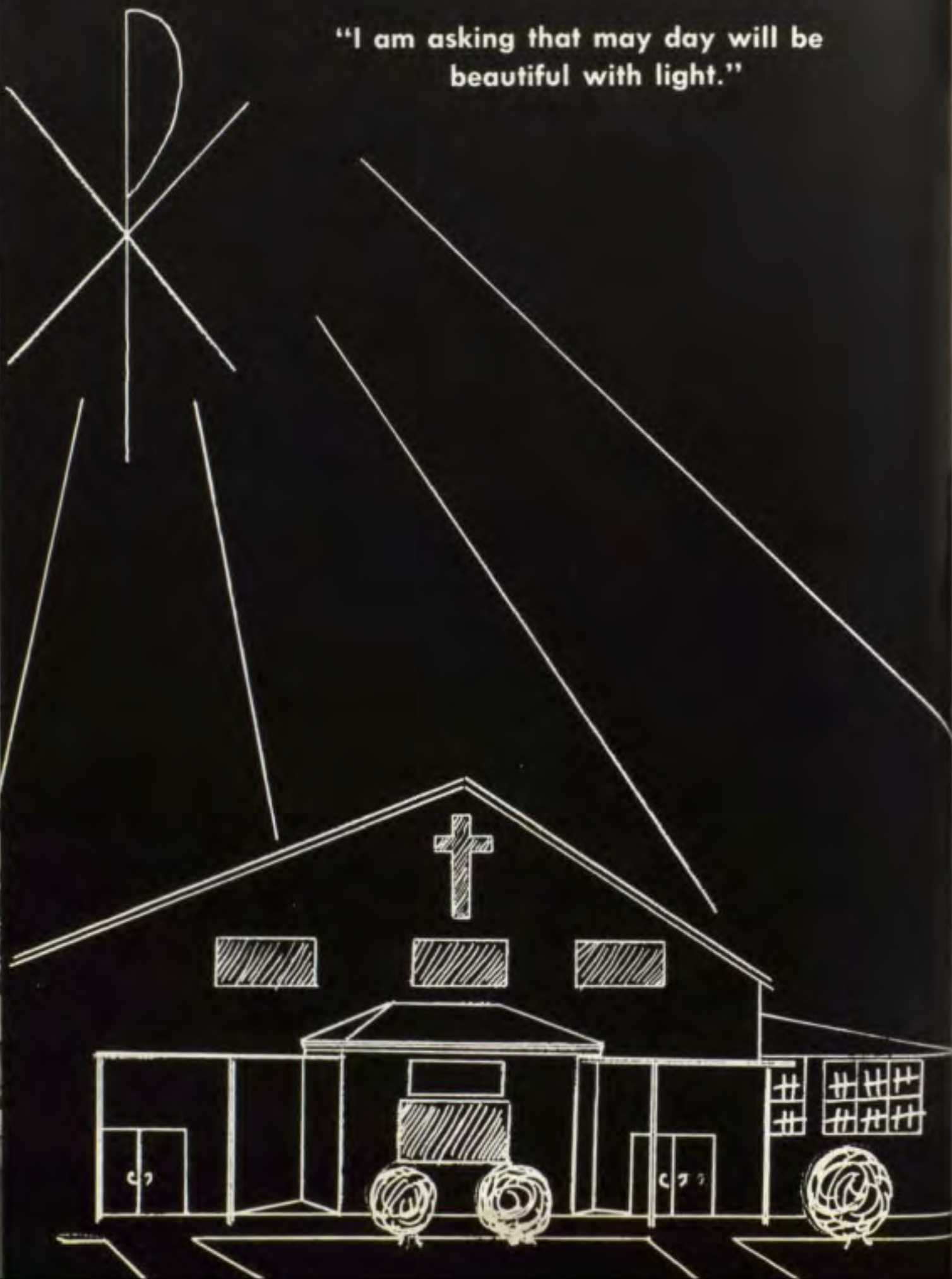

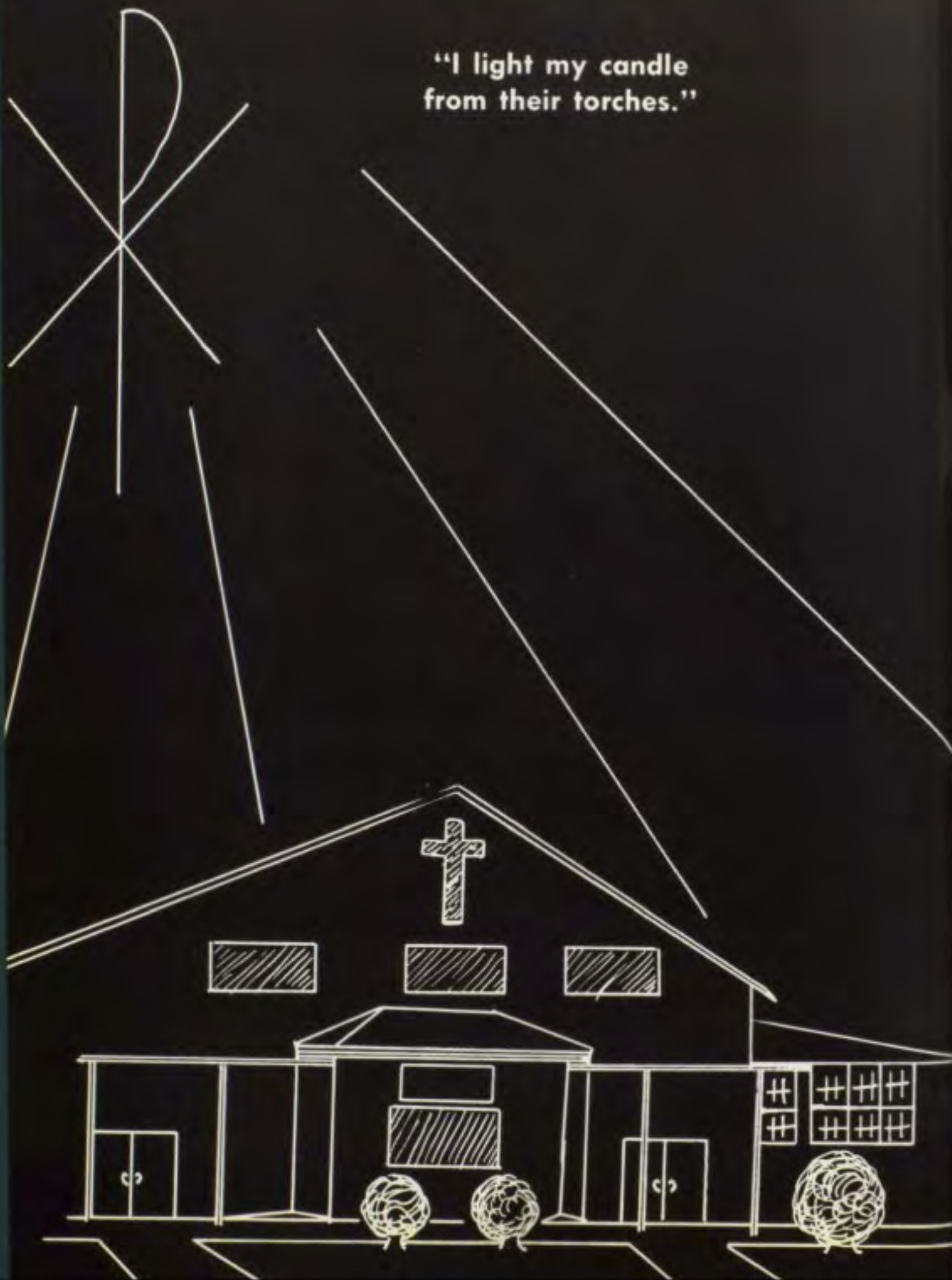

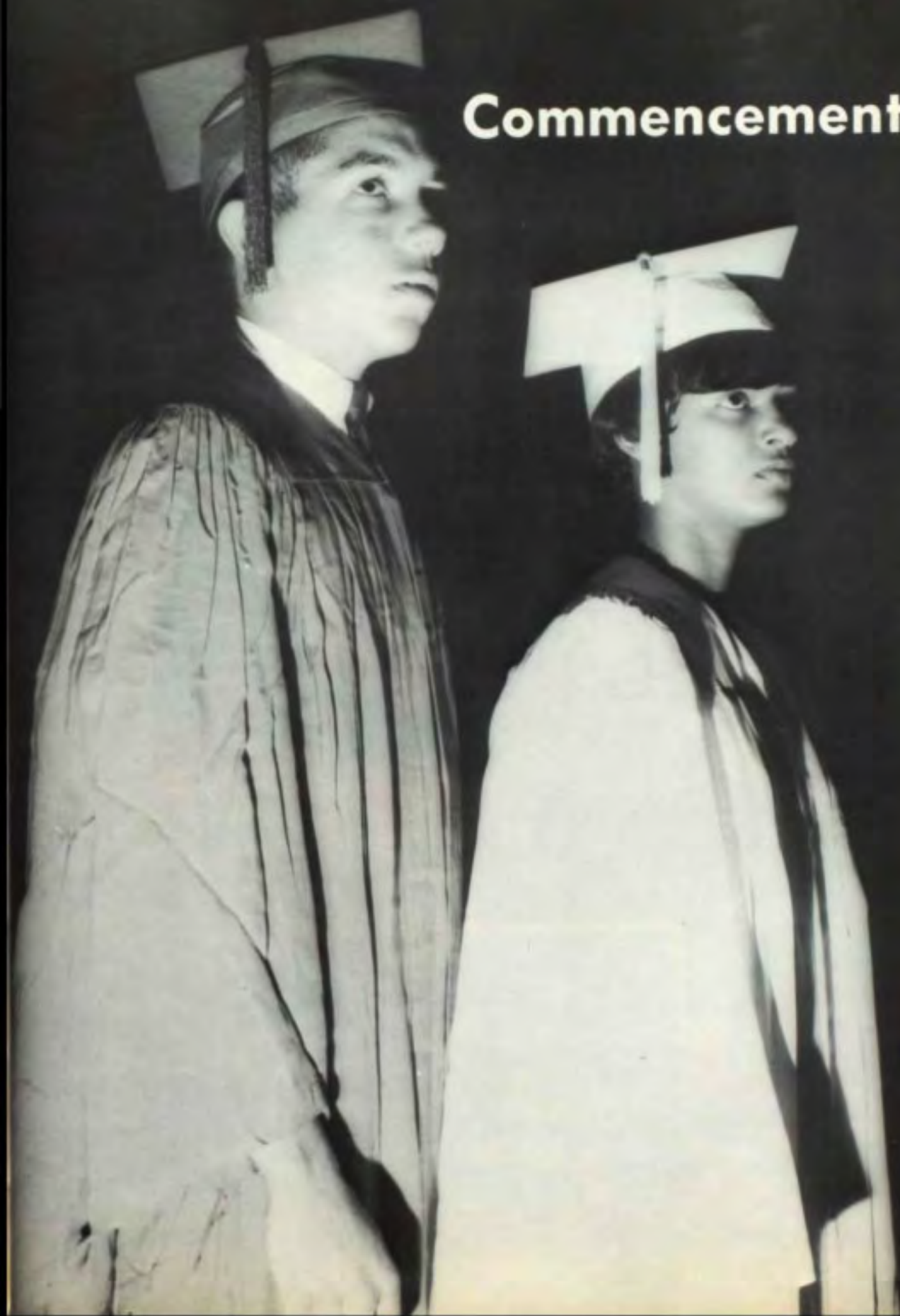
