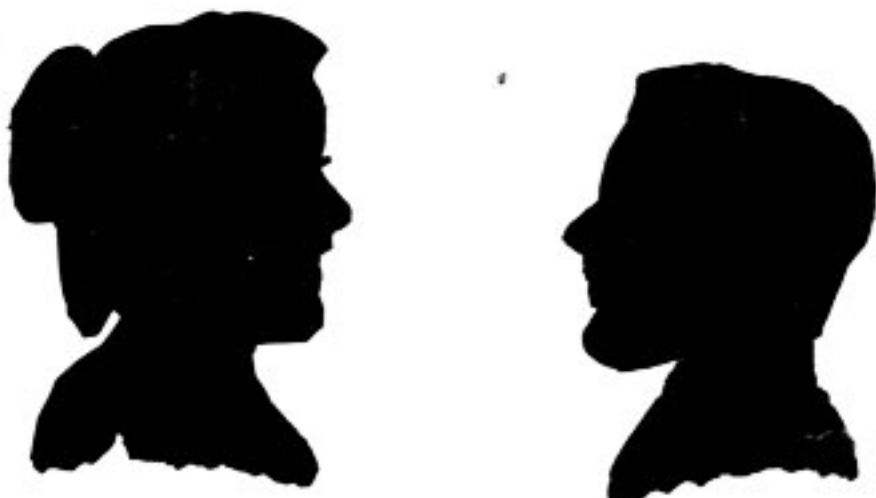
"A DECADE OF PROGRESS."

THE PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE



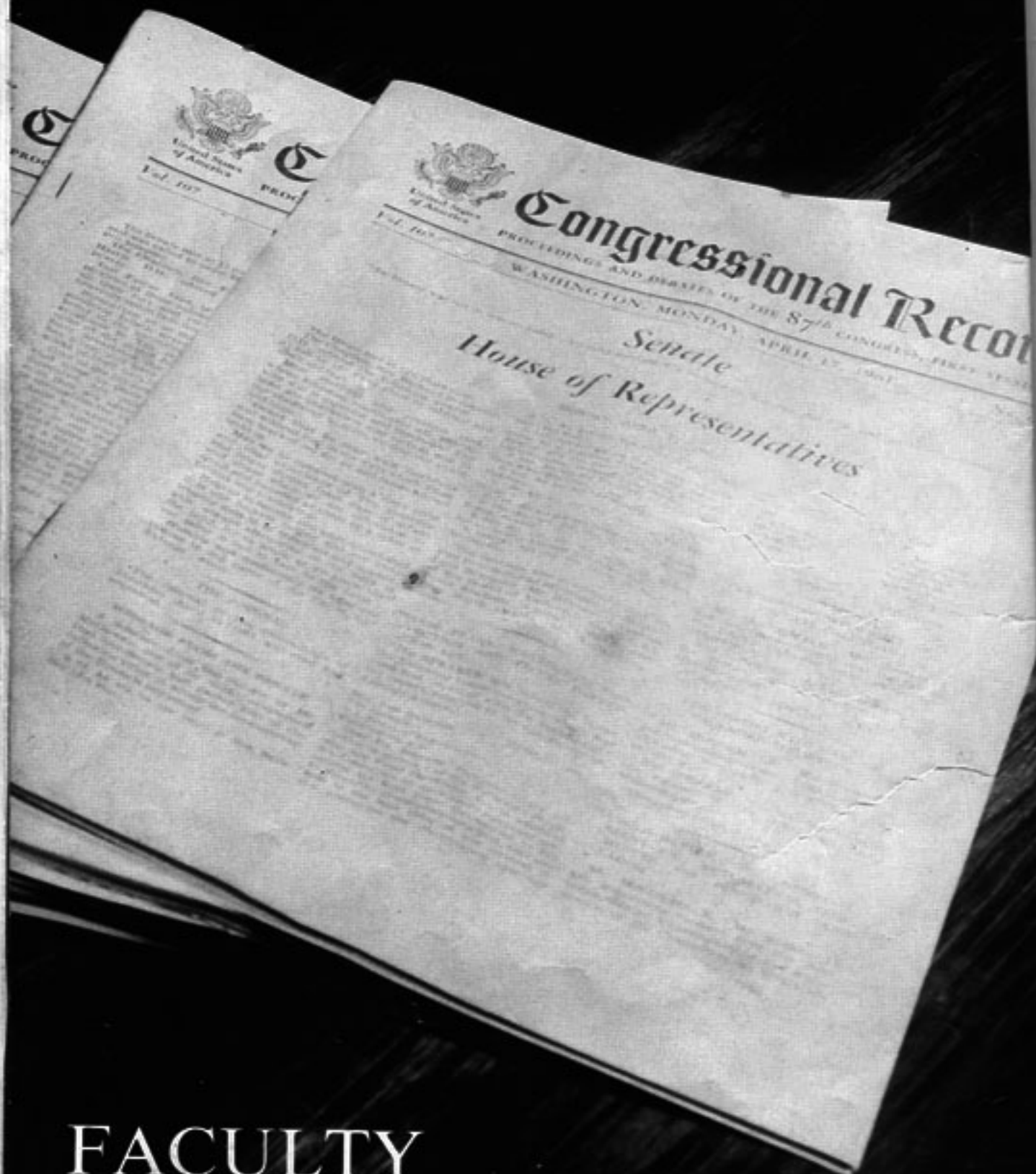
Greetings to the Editorial Staff of THE RAM:

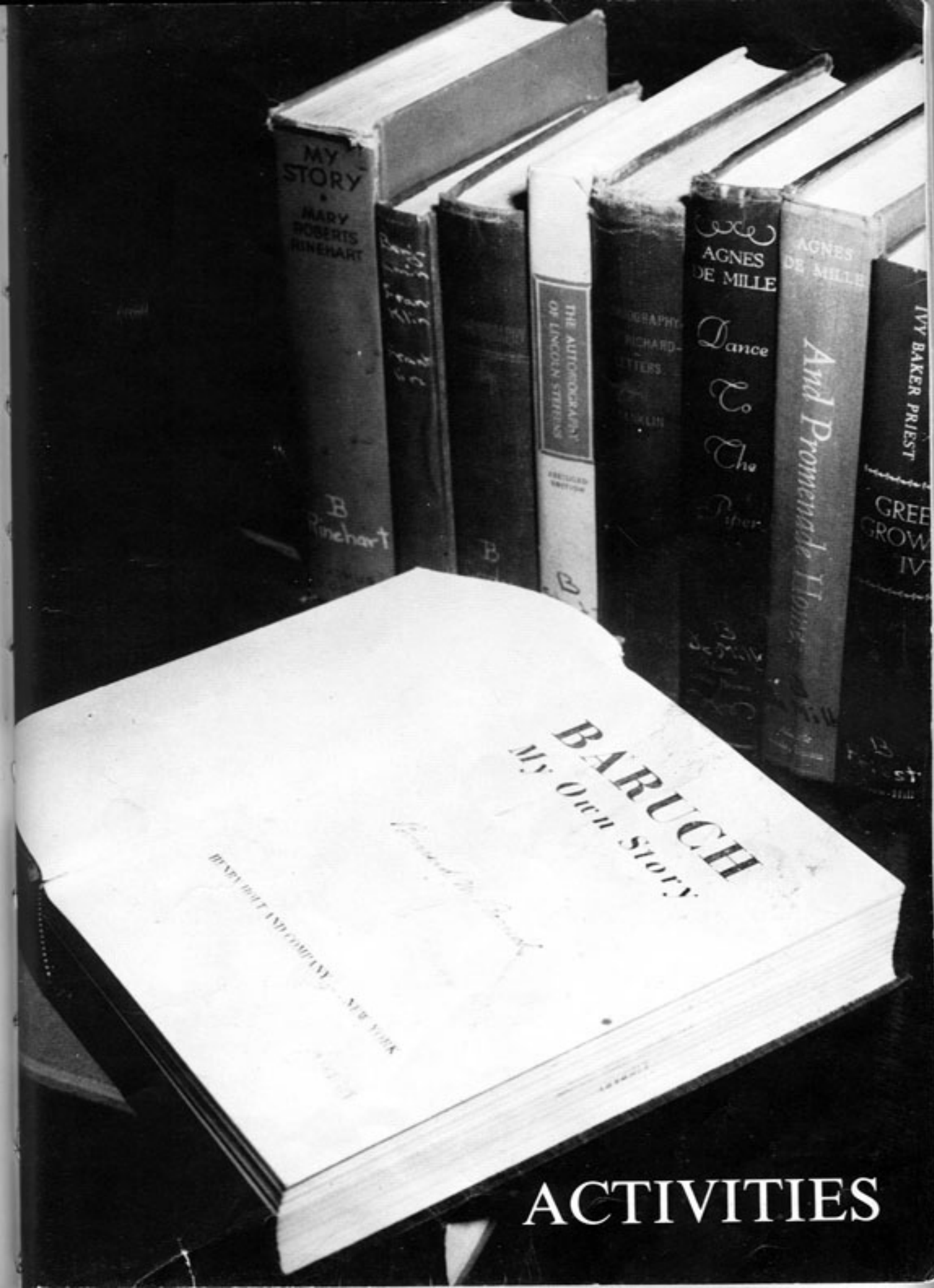
