The Principal's Message



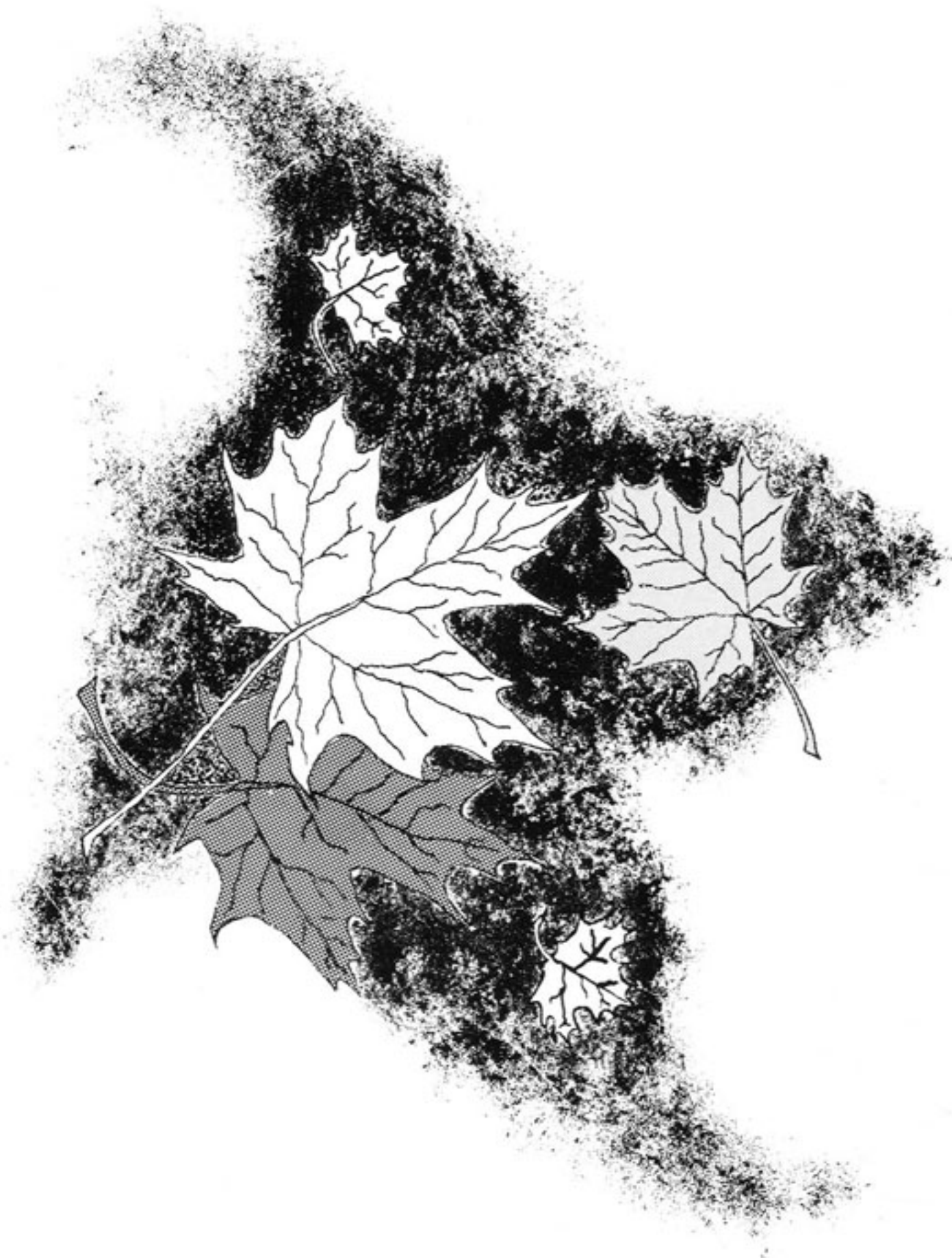
The faculty and staff work behind the scenes. However, it is an old theory that good students and good teachers make a good school.

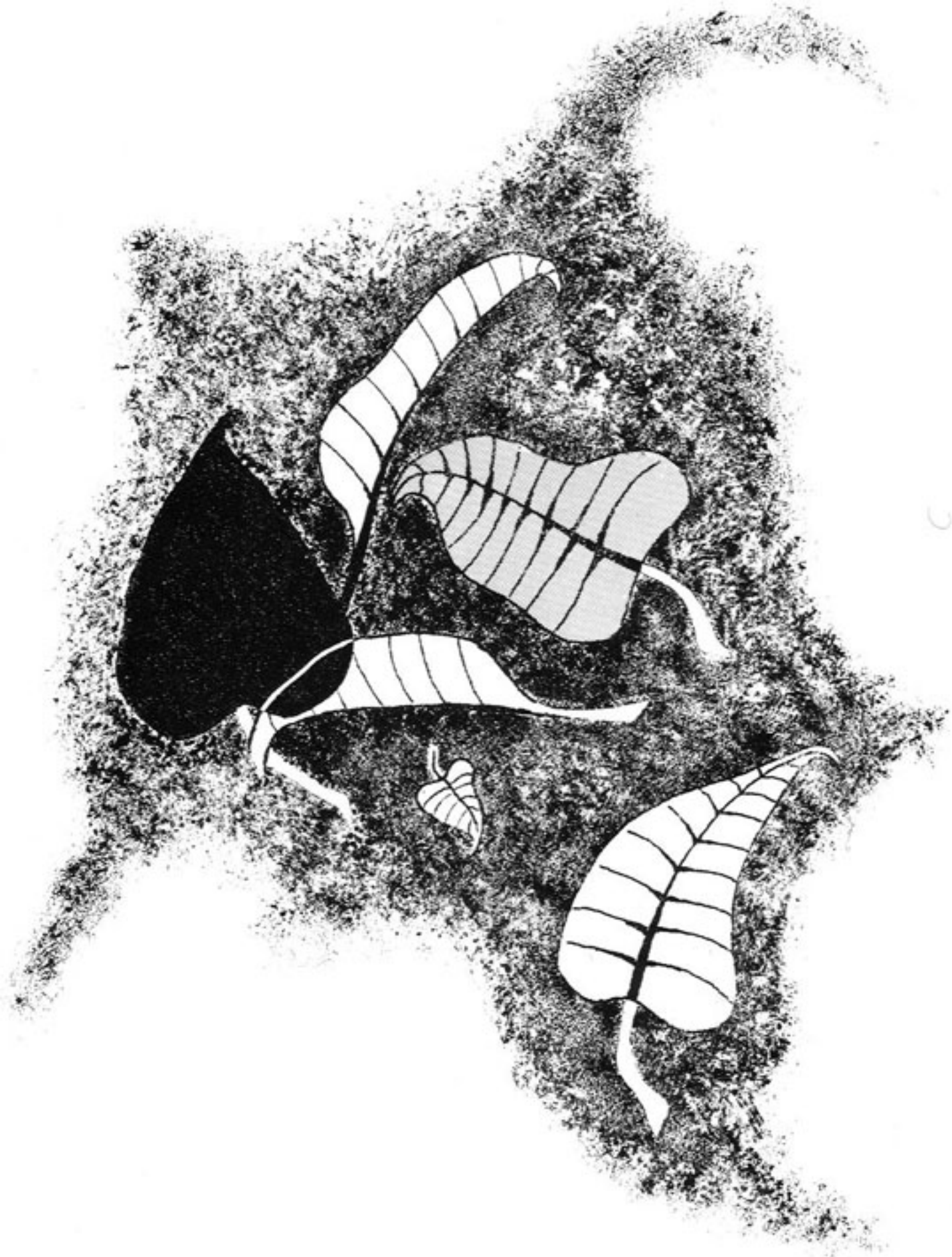
