In September 1960, Johnny Ray Nash entered Brown High as a freshman. His stay here was like the flickering light of a short candle. Early in the school year, he was hospitalized, and he remained in the hospital until breath would not keep. He expired as a result of a heart attack December 21, 1960. Johnny Ray will long be remembered by his friends, classmates, schoolmates and the faculty.

Odis Jefferson, a 1952 graduate of Brown High School, may best be remembered as an outstanding athlete, a student of diligence with a cheerful personality. He maintained a spirit of gratitude and proved the strength of a flaming hope. His life came to a tragic end December 10, 1960 in an auto accident while serving in the Armed Forces.
