

THE LIFE HISTORY OF THE RONEAGLE

As written by Miss Myrtle Watts for the initial issue of the yearbook in 1928

As the centuries, one after another, glide by, revelations more and more marvelous are brought to the ken of men. Perhaps the most extraordinary discovery of modern times is that of the Roneagle. This bird, beyond doubt the mightiest, swiftest, and most resourceful of all winged creatures, resembles in some respects the great American bald eagle. The Roneagle, however, is far larger in size; and it possesses a tremendous advantage over the other bird in that, through Mother Nature's inventiveness, its body - head, eyes, beak, breast, wings, talons, bones, muscles, nerves, and organs - is fashioned (marvel of marvels!) in Solid Iron! Because of this singular trait - which appears more miraculous when one discovers the bird accomplishing feats which, because of the great weight of even the iron feathers of its mighty pinions, would reasonably seem impossible - the creature has become known as the Roneagle - the iron eagle.

In only one spot in the world, the grim and sturdy structure known as McDonogh Thirty-five High and Normal School,¹ has the Roneagle chosen its aerie. There, beset with dangers before which weaker birds must flee, the Roneagle lives and thrives, requiring five years to evolve from the egg to the adult stage. Persons who have braved the blistering heat, the bitter cold, the furious stormblast, one or another of which, amid thunder and lightning, constantly vents its fury about the haunt of the Roneagle, have been astounded to find that the bird feeds only on hard, cold iron. This substantial diet contributes much to the development of the bird's prodigious prowess and resourcefulness.

The first step in the life-cycle of the Roneagle is known as the embryonic state. Twice a year - in early September and late January - ³ a number of eggs are brought into the world. From what has been said before, it will not seem strange to the reader to learn that these eggs are encased in shells of glittering steel, the reflection from which, as they glisten in the sunlight, is too strong for the naked eye. Each egg, protected by its strong armor from the dangers mentioned above, contains molten iron, which gradually takes the form of a tiny Roneagle.

By the end of a year ⁴ the young creature has acquired enough strength to break its steel prison, and a young Roneaglet finds itself for the first time in the world of living things. The bird is, of course, much dependent; and it becomes the duty of old and weathered Roneagles to bring to its nest daily portions of baby iron-food.

A year passes by, and the Roneaglet reaches the third stage of its life history. The sinews and the jagged iron feathers of its wings are now sufficiently strong for the young creature to make its first attempts at flying. By the end of the season it has become reasonably sure of itself in the air beyond its nest. And what rejoicing fills the sky when old Roneagles make known the fact that the young bird has acquired enough strength and skill to be let fly away unaccompanied by older Roneagles!

During the fourth step in the life-cycle of the marvelous bird, it seems to find a peculiar delight in out-distancing other winged creatures in flight. Miles above the clouds, unconscious of wind or rain or snow, its mighty pinions majestically outstretched, the Roneagle wings its way through the thin air with the speed of lightning.

Finally, during the fifth year after the laying of the great steel-shelled egg, the Roneagle emerges into the adult stage. Now the bird, having nourished itself for two years ⁸ on the most substantial of iron-food; having been hardened by storm and sleet, by summer's feverish heat and winter's deadening cold; and having gained in strength and initiative through participation in numerous contests, becomes a most wonderful creature. Perhaps some intrepid aviator, having piloted his plane far, far above the top of the world, has seen an adult Roneagle.⁹ It has by this time taken part in many struggles and has conquered countless adversaries. It is probably seen perched on some lofty mountain summit, its mighty talons rending the jagged rock, its great iron wings coldly glittering, and its fierce steel eyes, alive with lightning, intently seeking among the far distant stars new worlds to conquer.



THE PRINCIPAL SPEAKS

In this twentieth century--a society which produces extraordinary scientific and technological advances, which spawns mammoth consequences, and which, likewise, transforms the enslaved people of yesterday into the prime carriers of the freedom torch of today--it is an accepted fact that education is the "keystone in the arch of freedom and progress." You, my young friends, are the recipients of as well as the producers of the new look toward education.

I should like to pose for a moment a contrast in the concept of education of yesterday with the current one. I shall employ the per adult cliche expression: "When I was in high school," for purposes of comparison. In contrast, the high school student of today has guidance in planning with his parents his own program of studies. He even assists in formulating the nature of the instructional process. Through his student council, the student helps to shape the school organization. This gives expression of an awareness that the individual himself should share in making decisions which affect him. This is consistent with the basic concept of the cooperative and productive nature of the individual upon which the American democracy was established.

You are also facing and experiencing a new kind of revolution which is termed "cybernation." The new revolution centers around a production based upon electronic computer controlled machines, truly a magnificent scientific achievement of this age. The computer is a product of man's creative ability. The computer controlled machine frees man of many repetitive chores, and it frees his mind to produce additional ideas. Our changing world needs an influx of new ideas and different trends in thinking. The educational system which is to serve you must be geared to meet your needs and the diversified needs of the culture in which you live.

The world of today provides many opportunities for personal growth and preparation to live in a constantly evolving and exciting kind of world. My generation and I can only hope to adjust to the "new world." But, you, my young friends of today, have the challenge to help to create it.

OUR PRINCIPAL



Dr. Mack Justin Spears, an alumnus of McDonogh 35 Senior High School, was born in Wilson, Louisiana. At an early age his parents sent him to New Orleans, Louisiana, to attend school. He attended the Thomy Lafon Elementary School, the Hoffman Junior High School, the McDonogh 35 Senior High School, and the Valena C. Jones Normal School. He received the Bachelor of Arts degree from Dillard University and the Master of Arts degree from Xavier University. In 1952 he was granted a Harvard University Fellowship to study educational administration under the "Cooperative Program in Educational Administration"; from this university he received the Doctorate degree.

He has held teaching and administrative positions in New Orleans for the past thirty-one years. He taught at the Valena C. Jones Elementary School for fifteen years and was teacher-in-charge at the Joseph S. Clark Senior High School for one year. Following the Clark Senior High assignment, he served as principal of the Rosenwald Elementary School for three years and of the McDonogh 32 Elementary School for three years. Since 1954, he has been principal of the McDonogh 35 Senior High School.

Dr. Spears is quite active in educational and civic affairs and is in popular demand for educational and civic enterprises. He has worked on many committees and has been commended for his excellent work.

Now serving his third year as president of the Louisiana Education Association, he has likewise held the office of president of the New Orleans Chapter of the Dillard Alumni Association, as well as that of the National Alumni Association. Moreover, he was very active in the organization of the National Alumni Association, initiated the Dillard Alumni Awards movement, and conducted a successful drive to raise funds for Alumni Stadium.

Dr. Spears is active in several national educational organizations. He has been invited several times to participate on the program of the National Association of Secondary-School Principals Convention.

Recently he was invited to attend a special meeting on a study of the "Drop-Outs" by the Office of the Commissioner of Education in Washington, D.C. This meeting was under the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare.

He has served as chairman and co-chairman of the United Negro College Fund.

He is also an active participant in the Joint Administration Conference held at Southern University, and the Principals' Workshop at Dillard University.

As an ardent church worker, he is an ordained deacon of the Central Congregational Church and serves as moderator for the group.

He is married and the father of one daughter who is presently a senior student at Dillard University.

Since Dr. Spears has worked unceasingly for the improvement of the physical plant of the school, for the improvement of the quality of instruction and for the spiritual and moral growth of the boys and girls of McDonogh 35 Senior High School, he has caused the pupils of the school to grow to the best of their abilities in knowledge, in wisdom, and in grace with man and with God.
