

History and Development of NATCHITOCHES PARISH TRAINING SCHOOL

In the Year 1912, a committee of Negro citizens headed by Prof. J. W. Thomas bought a portion of land located on Jackson Square in the city of Natchitoches, for the purpose of erecting a school building for Negro boys and girls.

When in 1913, the building, a frame structure having three rooms, was completed, the citizens celebrated the opening of the school which they named Lincoln Institute, with dedicatory exercises.

The school, under the leadership of a faculty composed of three members, struggled along through the years with high hopes and aspirations.

In the year of 1919 the trustees of the Lincoln Institute deeded the property which served as a site for the School to the Parish School Board. Another room was added to the structure, and another teacher employed. In 1925 a new seven room structure was erected by the Parish School Board with the aid of the Rosenwald Fund, additional teachers were added bringing the total to nine, and high school work was begun.

Gradual and steady progress was made by the school, and in 1935 there was the addition of a work shop and its grounds.

This, by no means, marked the end of the school progress, for in 1938 the Parish School Board, with the assistance of the Public Works Administration, erected a \$50,000 frame structure. The building houses the administration offices and the elementary school.

The additional building and an increase in the student body necessitated an increased faculty, and additions which brought the total to twenty, were made, and in 1939, two instructors, including an agricultural instructor were added. The classroom instruction is in accord with modern trends in education.

The Changing Educational Scene

Gradually but surely the educational offerings for Negroes in Natchitoches Parish are approaching the desirable standard. Each year a change for the better is noticeable along many lines— buildings, length of term, curricula, and professional improvement of teachers.

Five years ago there were 68 schools in the parish—52 one-teacher, 11 two-teacher, 4 three-teacher, and one eleven-teacher. Today through consolidation and enlargement of teaching staff in a few schools we have 65 schools in the parish—38 one-teacher, 13 two-teacher, 10 three-teacher, 2 four-teacher and one twenty-two-teacher school. Four years ago 31 schools were taught in churches, 4 in old halls, 1 in an old house, and 31 in some kind of school building. Today 23 schools are taught in churches, one in an old hall, and 41 in school buildings.

The total number of teachers employed five years ago was 97, today there are 125; length of school term, 6 months in rural areas and 8 months for the training school. Today we have 7 months in rural schools and 9 months for the training school.

Teachers holding first grade certificates and above five years ago number 64, and those holding second 33; today those holding first grade, 96; having degrees, 26; second grade, 3:

This brief sketch of what is taking place educationally in Natchitoches parish is sufficient to show that the trend is definitely upward and the outlook brighter than at any time in the history of Negro education in the parish.

Demonstration Room

The Demonstration Room of The Natchitoches Parish Training School serves as a laboratory for the Teacher-Training Department here, and the Normal School of Grambling.

There are six grades in this room, divided off into four groups. All of the work is pupil-planned and each pupil selects the activities he wishes to carry out. The plan is to set up any number of situations, and let the pupils select what they want to do. No pupil is compelled or forced to engage in any activity he doesn't care to carry out. These pupils are carefully observed by the teacher at all times and often by Trainees and personnel from other educational centers. These pupils are not confined to grades, but work wherever they can. The higher groups serve as an inspiration to the lower groups and much incidental learning results from one teaching lesson.

This room is a branch room from its Mother school, Louisiana Rural Normal at Grambling.







This organization affords an opportunity to develop modern and successful farmers.






GIRLS' HI-Y CLUB

Student Government

The progressiveness of every country or school depends largely upon its citizens. Therefore our school saw the need of beginning a type of program that would help our students become better citizens today, in order to be good citizens of to-morrow.

During Good Citizenship Week, the week of October 12th, 1939, a number of persons were selected by the faculty as leaders and at the same time the student body related all of its activities to duties and traits of good citizens. It was during this week that the idea of Student Government was born in the minds of teachers and one hundred students.

The elections were carried out just as any national one, with two parties, Democratic party and Republican party, each having its own campaign manager. One week was alotted to the making of speeches, meetings, etc. It was surprising to see the amount of interest aroused on the part of the students. More interest was shown in this activity than in any activity previously had. Each person decided to vote for "Clean Politics." In the end, the Democratic party won, losing only one of its members, President of the Council. Afterwhich came Inaguration which was a very grand affair, our own Principal, Emeritus J. W. Thomas installed each officer.

The school is now known as a little city— Nakatoshia—with its Mayor, Commissioners, Council men and Ward members. We felt greatly our inadequacy to just take over things, without any training, so for a whole week one period was given for special training and study to the leaders. Now only one period a week is given.

The student leaders were finally ready to "take over" and did. The experiment is proving to be a great success, because the students are realizing more and more their responsibilities as leaders. They give programs without the help of instructors, they carried out their classwork in the absence of teachers: they take care of their problems of discipline in a very fine way. In fact disciplinary problems are becoming fewer

and fewer. The young people have almost ceased to need the help of instructors except for guidance.

We have made quite a step forward in progressive education and hope that in the very near future, we will have reached the utmost point.

Looking through the "Mirror" we come first to a group of ambitious young people that were chosen for student leaders. They have made a splendid job of it.

Leading this group is Miss Era Mae Blakely, Mayor: her personal secretary, Miss Jeanie Kirkland. Next in rank are the comissioners. executive body. Commissioner of Finance. Thurston Williams: Commissioner of Worship, Virgie Williams: Commissioner of Education, Lloyd Lacour: Commissioner of Welfare. Thaddeus Burton: Commissioner of Safety. Walter Lewis: Commissioner of Reference, Gethesemane Hall: Commissioner of Works, Murray Hall.

The next group is the law makers or body. President of Council, Jessie V. Ramond: Vice-President of Council, Gertrude Johnson.

Each class or ward is represented in this group with two persons. Every ward has a patroleum, nurse dietician and all the officers of a city. Defending the city is Miss Essie Burton, District Attorney, and V. L. Desadier, Supreme Judge. Ahead of the Police Department is A. B. Desadier. In fact the system is so arranged that it takes in just about the entire student body, which causes everything to go on as one large machine, every part in harmony with the other.

The person having direct charge of the student government officials is Mrs. Odile C. Johnson, to whom we are especially grateful for her splendid help.




