Coach Henry Crosby's Lincoln Trojans will meet the McKinley Panthers here Saturday, 7 p. m., at West Jefferson Stadium for the Southern Regional Championship in the Louisiana Interscholastic Athletic and Literary Organization.

Lincoln decked Washington of Lake Charles, 20-7, in the semifinal round, after drawing a first round bye. The Trojans won the LIALO District III crown, and are strong contenders for the state title.

The Trojans' Wilfred Randall sparked Lincoln to victory over the Indians with two touchdowns on 19 and five - yard runs.

Gregory Brown and Roy Benjamin both have starting assignments and will have the scoring burden along with Randall on their shoulders.

Coach Carl Stewart's charges moved into the semifinal round when McKinley turned back a potent Central of Bogalusa, 19-6.

Les Nicholson is Randall's counterpart in the Panthers' scoring department. Nicholson ran two touchdowns against Central in the Panthers' triumph.

Fullback Wilfred Randall passed for two Lincoln scores and Lloyd Benjamin returned a Panther punt 30 yards for the other. Both came in the first period.

Randall fired 30 yards to flank-er Kermit Brook in the first quarter and six yards to Thomas Scrubbs in the third. It climaxed a 42-yard Trojan drive set up after safety Elton Taylor intercepted a McKinley pass.

The Panthers' fourth period score came when quarterback John Ephrom threw five yards to Wycliff Robinson.

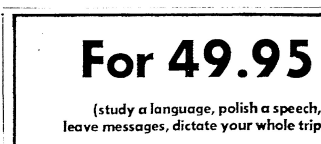

Landry Tourney to Open Friday

The L. B. Landry Christmas Holiday Doubleheader will feature four of the LIALO (Triple A) teams Friday in the Buccaneers' gym on the west side.

According to coach Vic Vavasour, the Bucs' head basketball coach and director of the stellar cage attraction, the games will start at 6:30 p.m. with the McDonogh 35 Roneagles and Violet Consolidated, while Landry and Greenville Park of Hammond will meet in the nightcap round.

Greenville's Daniel Jackson, a 6-8 senior and Charlie Anderson, 6-7, of Landry, are among the most promising basketball players in the prep ranks today. The Violet Bulldogs' Henry Reed has averaged better than 25 points per game. Irving Williams and Curtis Simmons will pace McDonogh's attack.

The trio of Michael Davis, Hammond; Kenneth Thomas, Landry, and Johnny Lewis of Violet, are among other standouts who are slated to participate. Greenville will come to the Landry Doubleheader with a 10-0 standing, while the Bucs' have a 10-2, and have been selected as the "quintet to beat in LIALO's District V" this season.
