During the course of the evening a prize was awarded to the one having the best costume. We were delighted when one of our classmates, Albertine Bolivar, won the prize of twenty-five dollars. The dance ended promptly at midnight. We, the seniors of '50, will be honored to be the first to hold our commencement exercises in the new gym.

So far I have not mentioned our scholastic activities. I have only recalled some of the momentous events which have helped to make our routine school work a pleasure.

How could we possibly forget those Freshmen days spent in English class with Sr. M. Marguerita! Latin was also one of our favorite subjects, with Sr. M. Margaret as instructor. Each one of us can remember the sound of the oral recitation of all the tenses of "portare" and other familiar Latin verbs which we recited each day. Neither will we forget Caesar and the Roman wars.



In '47 what class was rated the most studious? The Sophomores of course! We were never found without an algebra or biology book. With Sr. Marie Celine we dealt with ratio and proportion, equations and everything else listed under the title Algebra. It was hard work, but after all that which requires no trouble is not worthwhile. Mother M. Gabriella thought us to be the best Biology class she had ever had. In Religion class our teacher, Reverend Father Gallagher, through his instructions, showed us the Christian way of life. A favorite class of the girls was Home Economics with Miss Monette. We enjoyed cooking every Tuesday and Thursday. As a special treat we prepared and served a delectable dinner for the Seniors of that year. It made us happy and proud to see them enjoy our cooking.

The coming of our Junior year witnessed the establishment of a beautiful new library. We are proud to own the largest and best equipped library in this section of Louisiana. Sr. M. Hubert, our librarian, keeps it decorated with humorous but educational pictures and cartoons. Sister is always there to help us. We Juniors were usually found in the library, grouped at the table looking up references on noted historians for history class. French, History and Geometry were our three main subjects. This year also



saw the division of our hall into four beautiful classrooms by our former Pastor, Reverend Father Recktenwald.

A favorite with us is Macbeth. Besides reading the drama we have recordings of it which help us to interpret the play better. At the end of the English period we girls ascend to the Sewing Room with our teacher, Mrs. Daietta St. Mary. In this class we have made many lovely apparels. We are now making the costumes for our presentation of the Operetta, "Gypsy Troubadour". The bell terminating this class announces lunch time. In the afternoon we return to school with refreshed minds for two of our main subjects; Chemistry and French. Since we are in the Atomic Age, we find Chemistry most valuable. Every Monday, Wednesday and Friday we have Physical Education. On Tuesday and Thursday we enjoy our music class.

I must not forget to say that on Wednesday of each week the student body of Sacred Heart School attend Mass at 8:15 A.M. to ask God's blessing on our work. On the second Sunday of each month, the Sodality attend Mass and receive Holy Communion wearing our white dresses, veils and blue capes.
