## FOREWORD

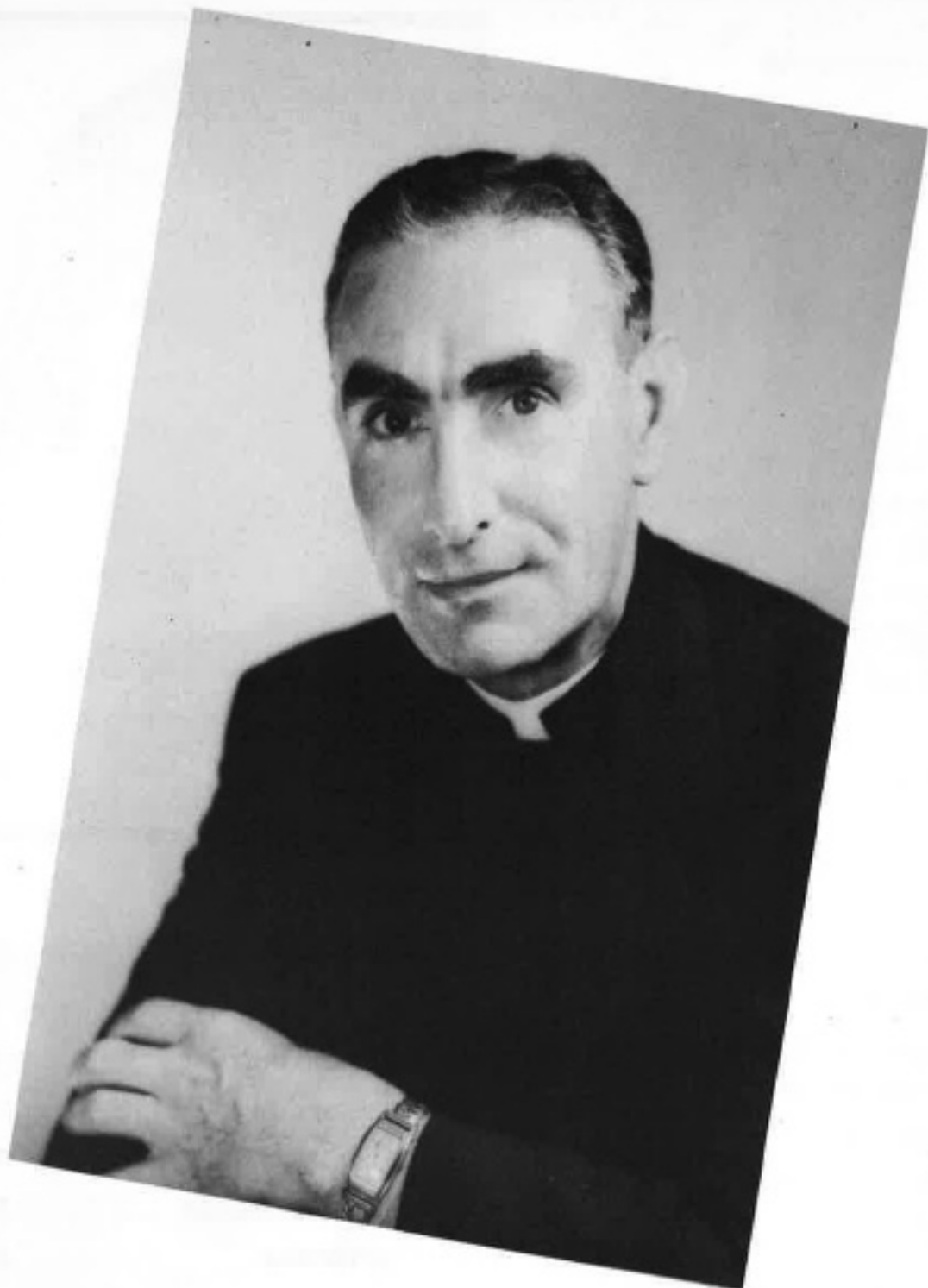

Freshmen may ask for any help in solving simultaneous linear equations. Edgar Barrow and Dolores Alex are sure of two methods at least, as you can see.

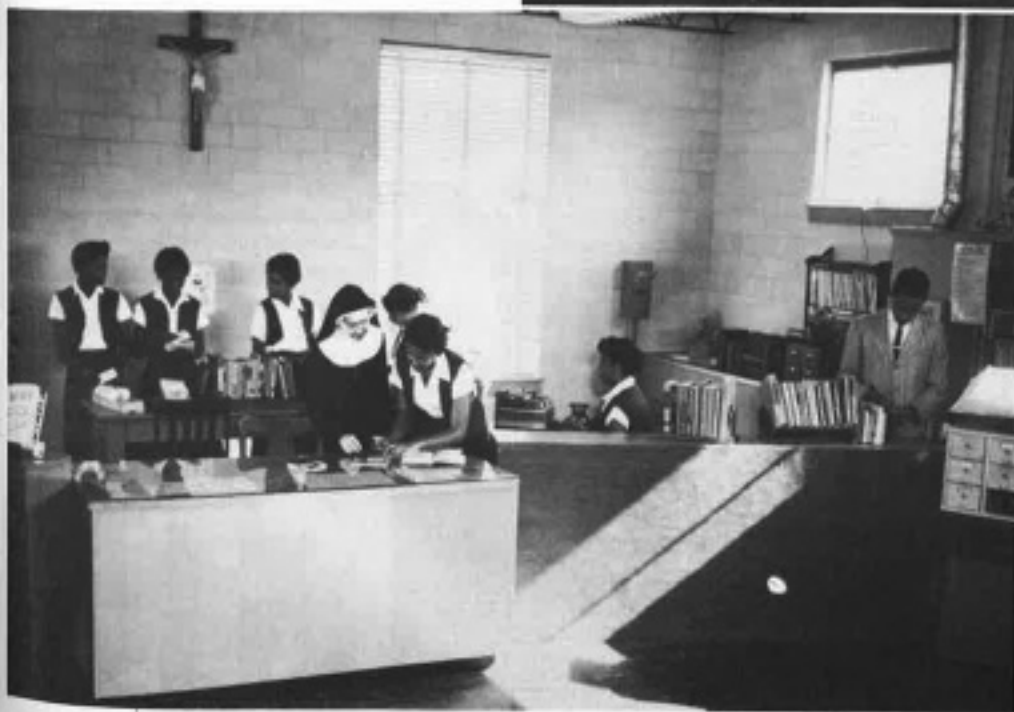

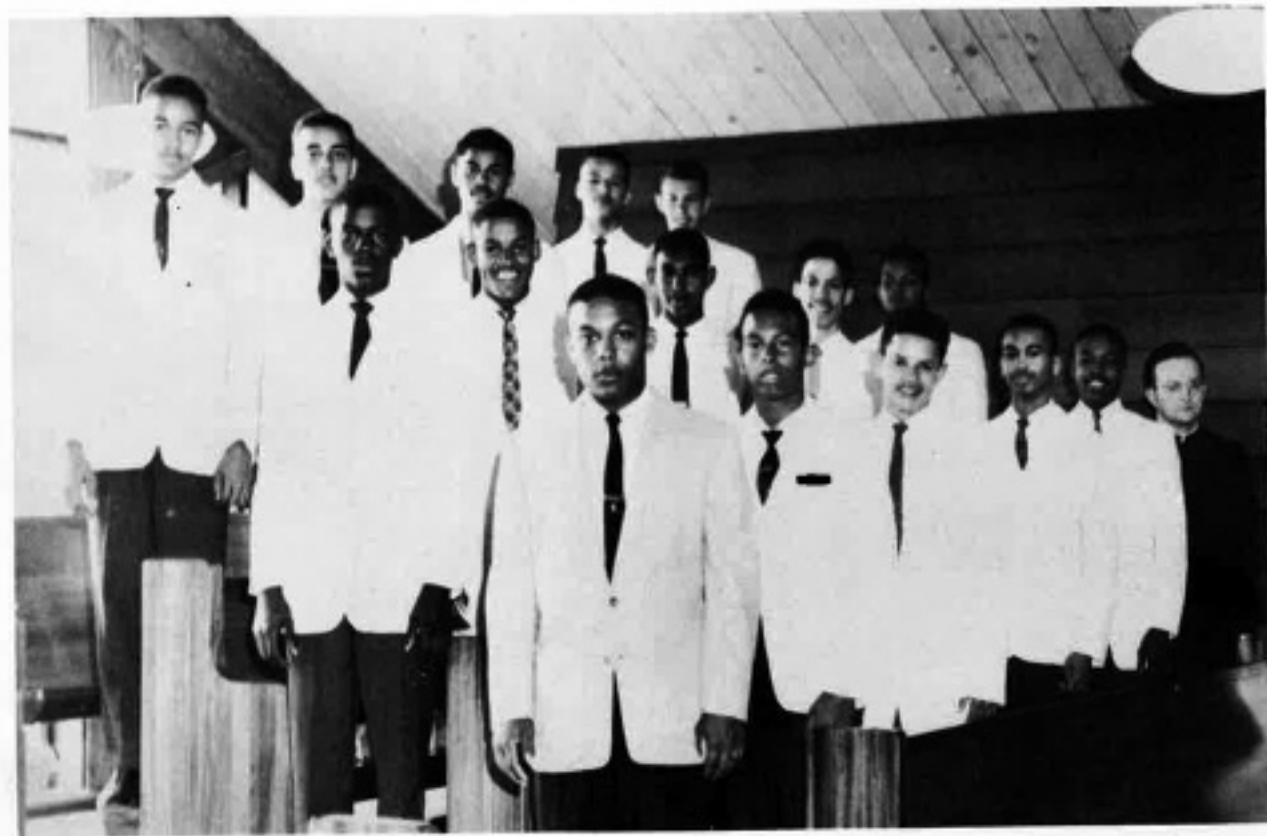

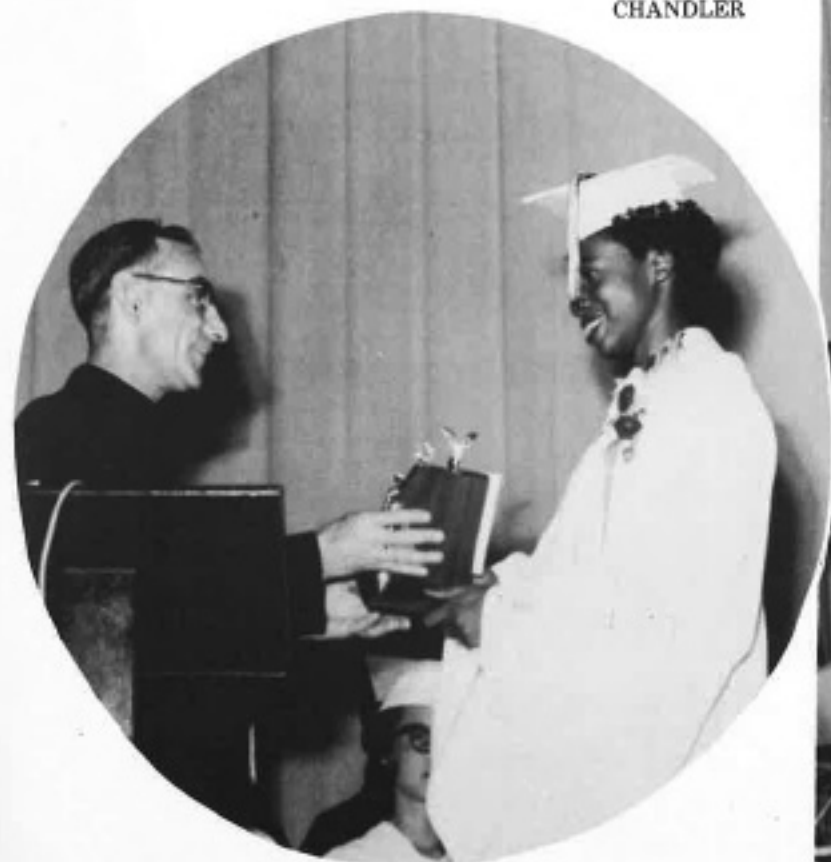

Gilmore, was high point man for the Vikings with 29 points in the final quarter.

The most thrilling game of the tournament, however, was the DeQuincy-Plaisance affair.

As the finals got underway, the Vikings came out shooting. This was the big one, the one they had to win. In previous years, both the champion and runner-up received a berth in the state championship tournament.

This year, however, the rule was changed — the regional runner-up is now listed only as an "also ran." Only the champions enter the state championship playoffs.

Coach Post had his strategy planned. His boys successfully contained Clarence Walker and got off to a 23-12 lead in the first quarter. At the end of the half, they held a 26-point lead and the Tigers were down for the count.
