"May the Son of God Who is formed in you grow strong and become for you great gladness and exaltation and perfect joy."

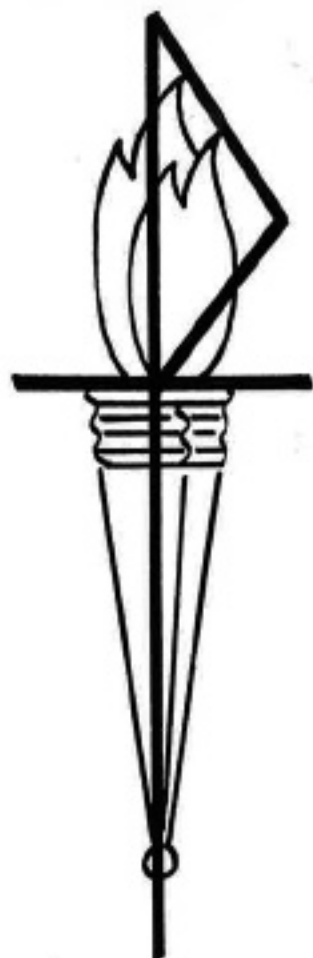

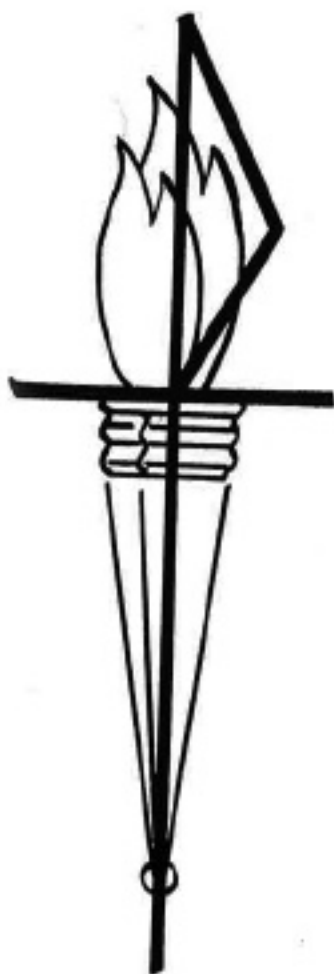

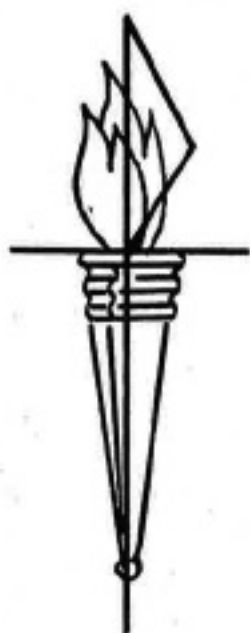
