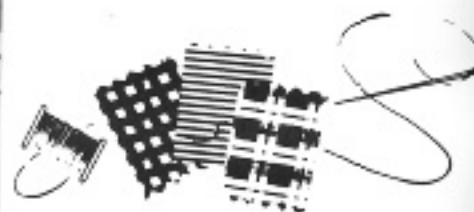

The Bloodhounds

When Coach Johnnie Pegues came to Notre Dame in the Summer of 1960, he inherited a one year old team whose record was 0-7 the previous season. He also inherited a powerful and ambitious fullback in Charles Washington. Along with him came the throwing arm of James Chalmers; the explosive speed of halfback M. J. Pennywell; the sure hands of D. and J. Metoyer, the fleet foot running of halfback

Billy Jackson and Harold Walker, the deadly tackling of Amos Buckner, E. Holden, and L. Jones, and most of all the blocking which was executed magnificently by J. Goines, J. "Tuson" Abron, C. Davis, S. LaCour, C. Pierson, V. Farley and V. Vann.

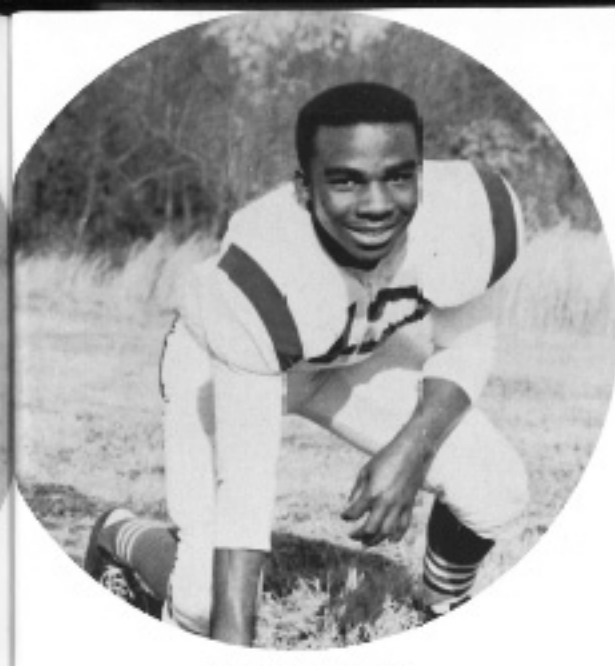
