

45-50 Negro Schools Slated To Enter Track Relays Here

Between 45 and 50 Negro schools are expected to take part in the Invitational Relay Carnival to be held Saturday, April 21. at the St. Landry Training school.

The program will be made up of 22 track and field events, featuring 15 of the high school division and seven in the elementary division.

Seven of the schools which will participate will be from Texas.

A queen will be chosen from St. Landry Training School to reign over the relay carnival.

Events on the card are the 100 yard dash, 440 yard dash, 880 yard run, mile run, 70 yard high hurdles, broad jump, high jump, shot put, javelin throw, discus throw, 440 yard relay, 120 yard low hurdles, shuttle relay, sprint medley relay, distance medley relay, mile relay.

This will be one of several big meets for the host St. Landry Training school Bulldogs.

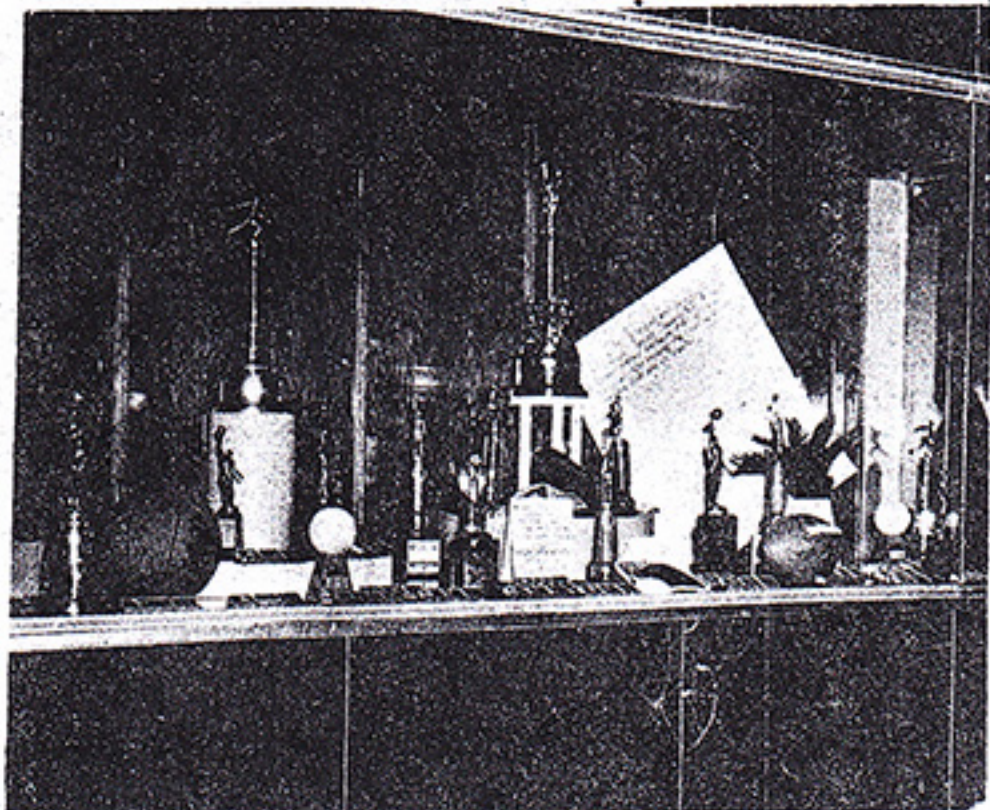

Blue Streaks Win St. Landry Relays ¹⁹⁵²

Gaudet High School of New Orleans successfully defended its championship by winning the St. Landry Relay Carnival at Opelousas with a total of 50½ points. The Meet was held on Saturday, April 19th at Harlem Park with fifteen schools participating.

Copping six first places the Blue Streaks of Gaudet took the meet with B. T. W. second with 32 points; Landry third with 31 points and Xavier Prep fourth with 30 points.

Nathaniel Woods was high point man for Gaudet scoring 12¾ points. Edward Bourgeois of Xavier Prep received the outstanding performer Award.

George Gardiner of Cohen High won the Emerson Invitational 100 Yard Dash in the excellent time of 10 seconds.

Booker T. Washington relieved Gaudet of its St. Landry Mile Relay Championship by winning that event. Gaudet placed second in the Mile Relay.

Cohen Wins LIALA Track Meet

Eight records were crumbled and one tied as Walter L. Cohen of New Orleans garnered 42 points to take front-runner laurels in the Third Annual LIALA Track and Field Meet held at Southern University Saturday afternoon. The Green Hornets, who scored heavily in the field events, were pursued by a trio of Crescent City entries in Landry with 35 points, Xavier Prep 26 and Booker T. Washington 23. Fifth was popular J. S. Clark of Opelousas which tallied 20 markers.

Eight Records Fall; One Tied

Five of the twenty teams entered in the meet shared in crumpling eight of the existing 14 records and tying one. The records fell in split variety. Four were tumbled on the cinder paths and a quartet were shattered on the field.

Willie Dempsey of Booker T. Washington, individual scoring leader with 14 points, broke two field records by hurling the discus 121' 9/4" and heaving the shot put 49' 1/4". He set both records in 1952.

Perhaps the biggest surprise was rendered in the pole vault when R. Rivet of Cohen squashed the existing 1952 record of 10'6" held jointly by Primus of Chaneyville and Breaux of Gaudet by leaping for a new record of 11'1". He failed in three attempts to better his own record-shattering leap. R. Young of Landry rewrote the javelin throw mark of 113'6" by tossing it 129'6".

Gardner Takes 100, 220

Walter L. Cohen's Gardner, a mercury-footed sprinter with his dash of a thoroughbred, had his name perforated into the books for his record time of twenty-two seconds flat in the 220 yard dash. He out-legged his century mates to top the 100 yard dash in 10.1.

Gilbeau of Opelousas' J. S. Clark, went the 220 yard low hurdles distant in the record time of 25.2 while Mack of Landry clipped 7 seconds off his 1952 one mile time for a 4:39.4 record.

Three competitors, Terrell of Cohen, Edwards of Xavier Prep and Swayne of Landry crossed the bar at 5'10" in the high jump.

SU Kittens Scores 11 Points
Southern High School gathered most of the esteem for the local entries by amassing 11 points. The Kittens placed in five different events. Their best performances came in the 120 yard hurdles where Sewell placed second and in the mile relay. They took third in this event.

Zachary picked up 4 1/4 points and Chaneyville got three-fourths on the efforts of Clovers Primus.

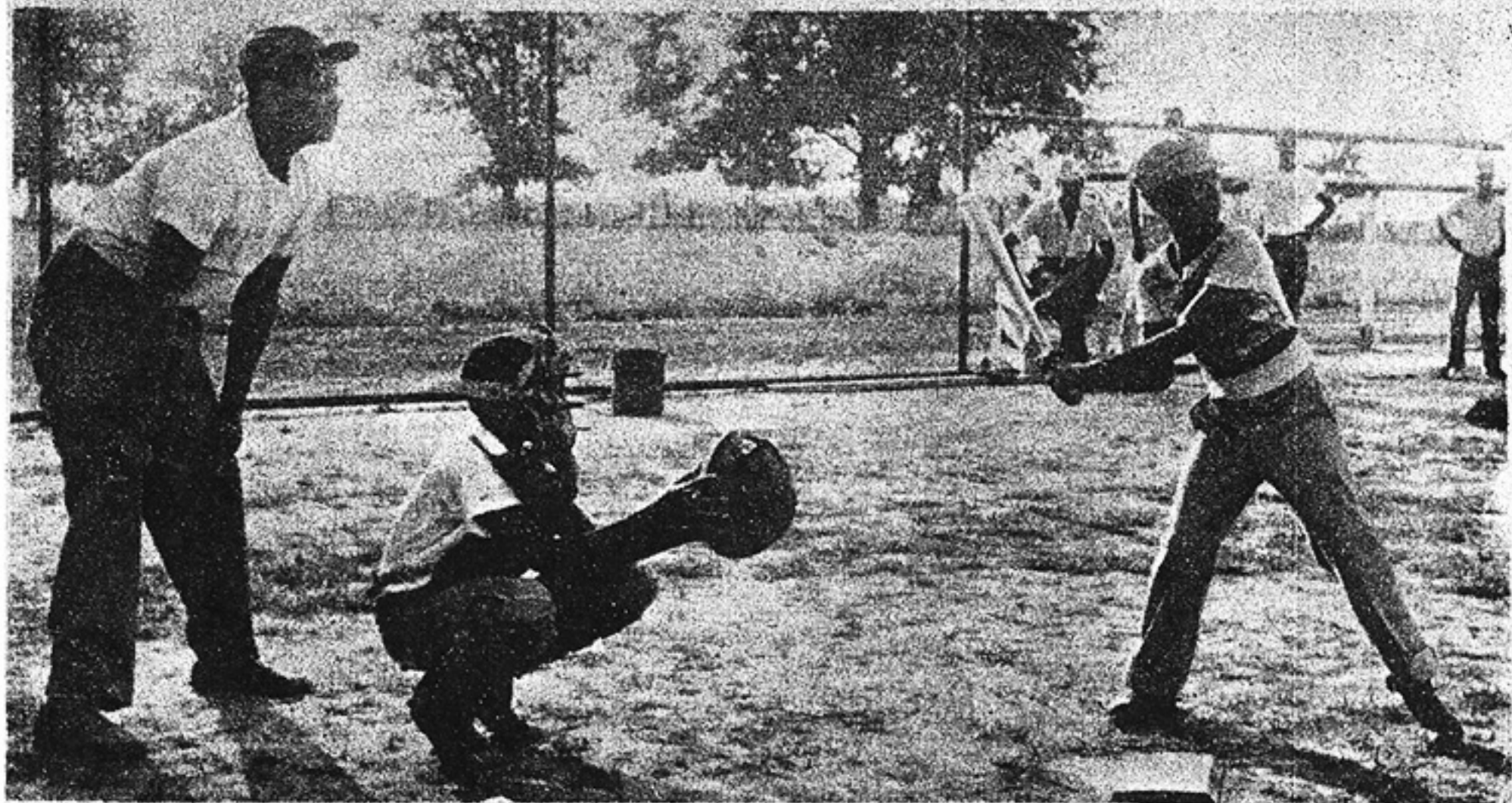

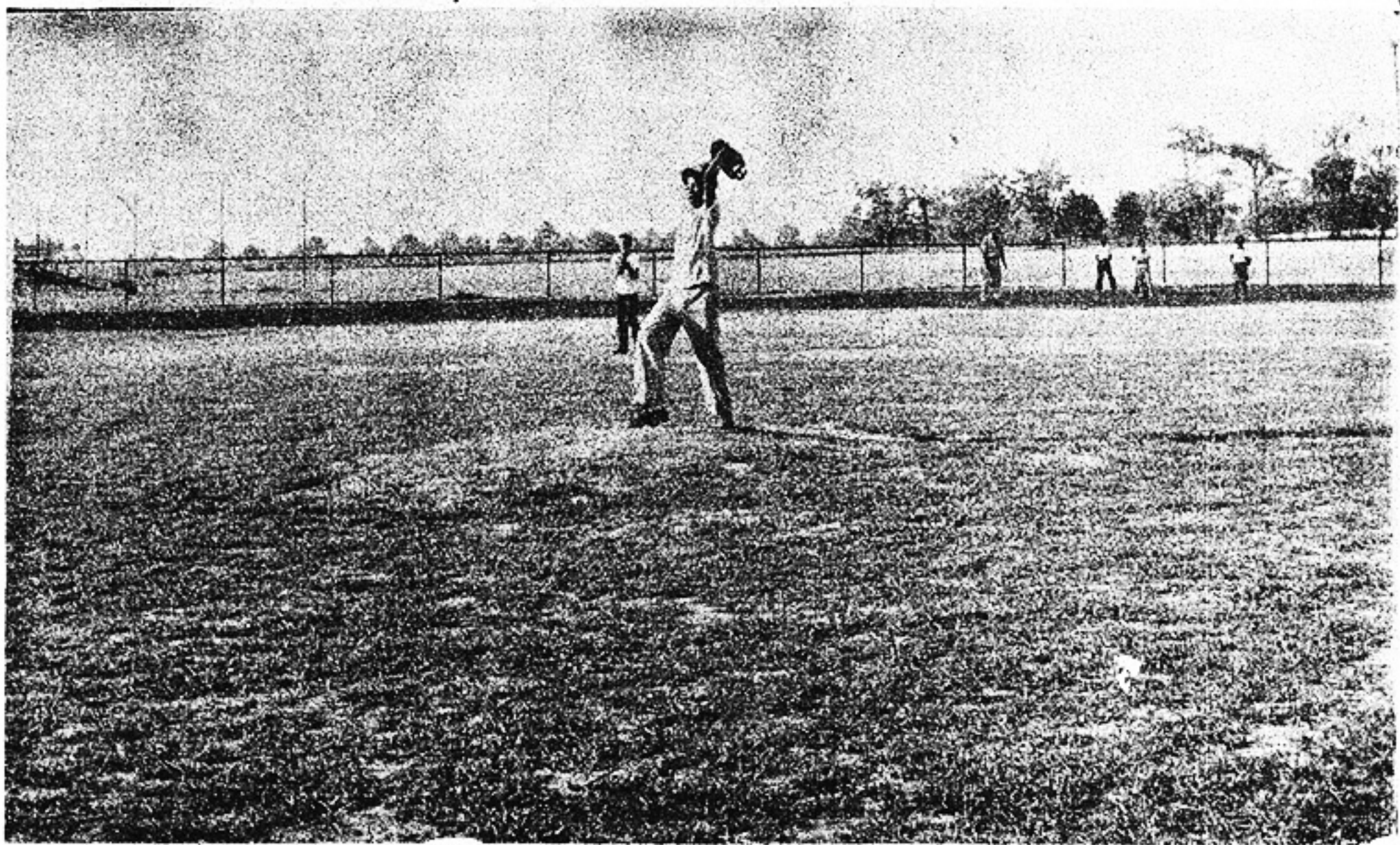

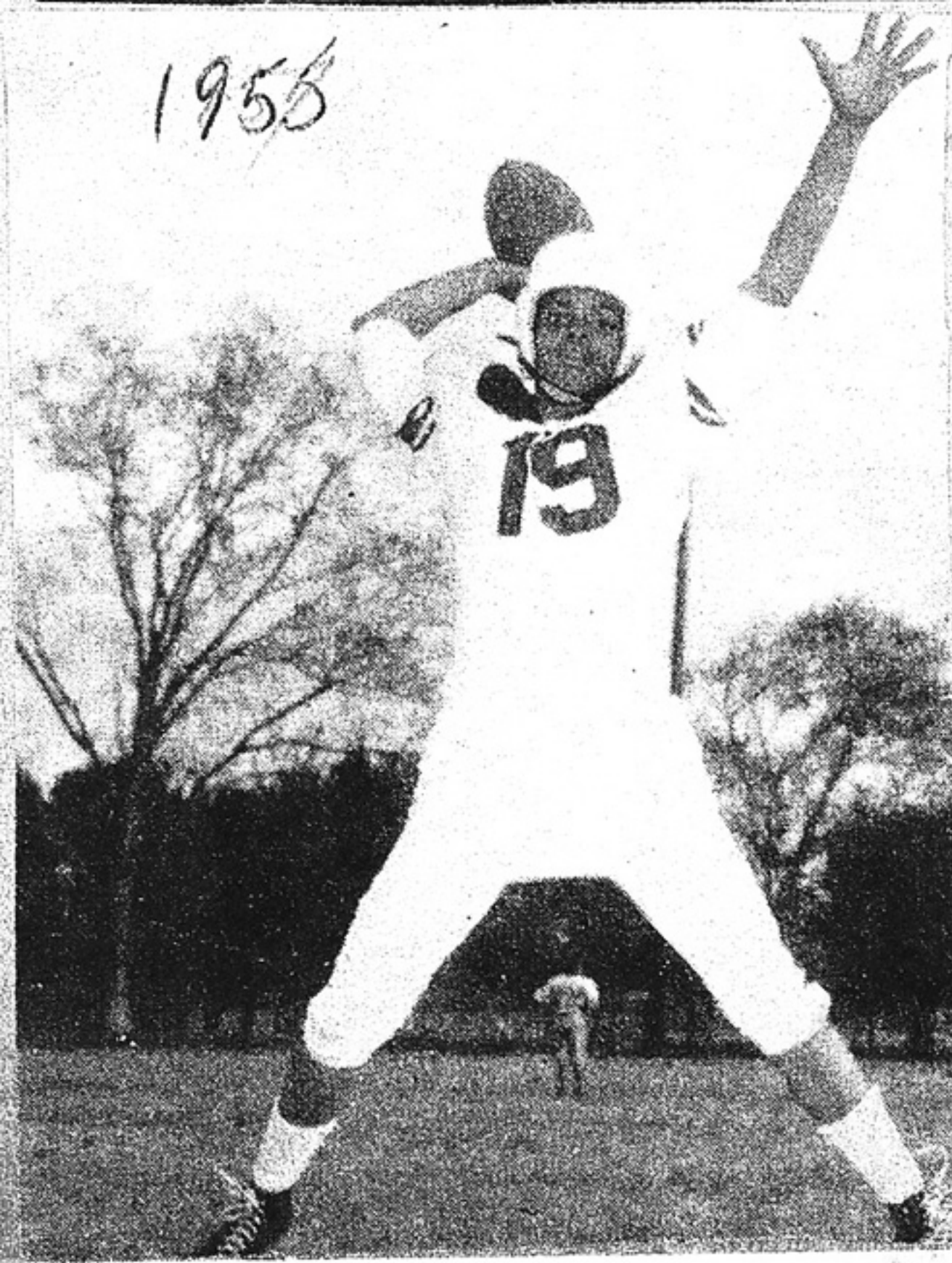

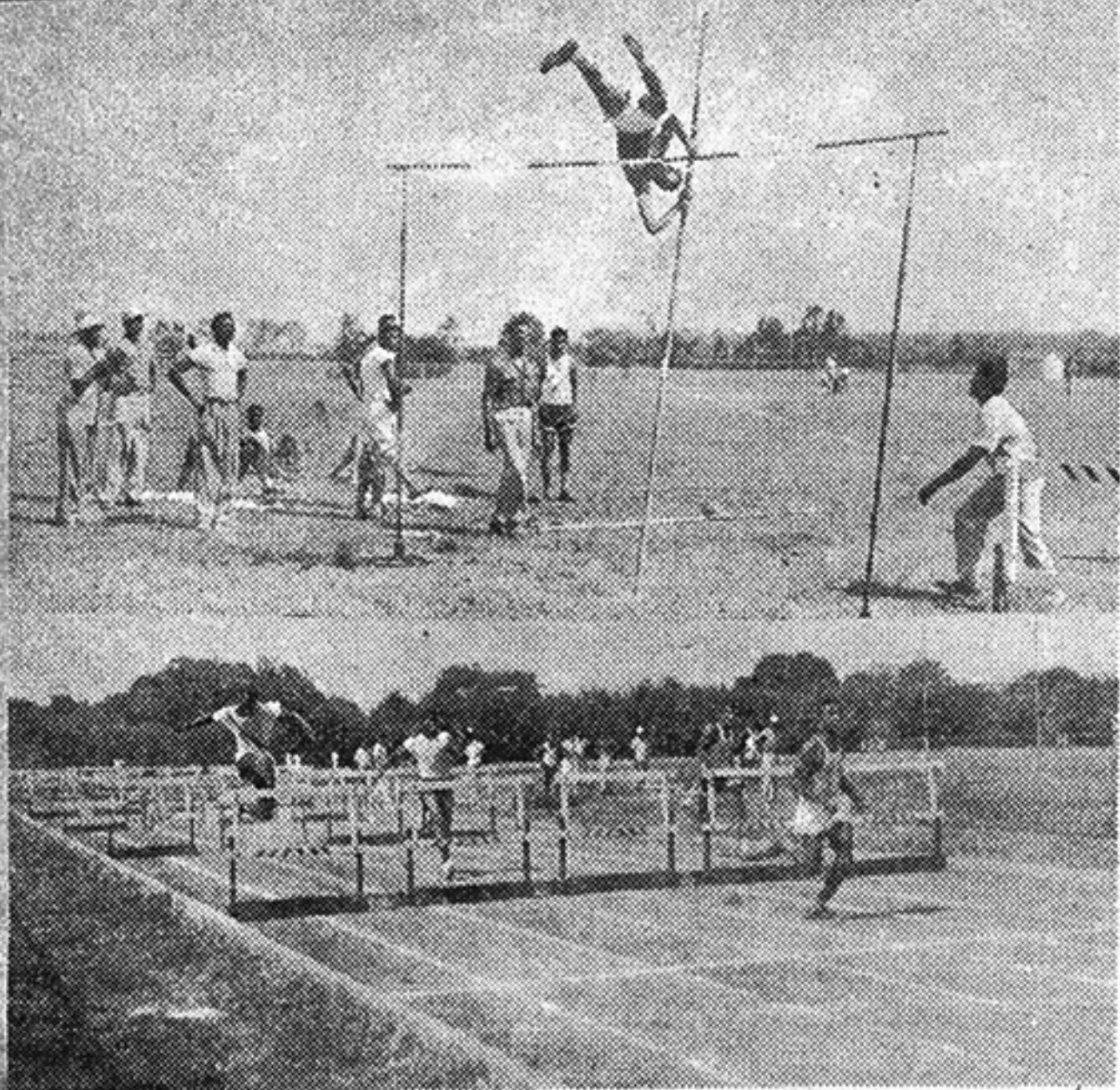

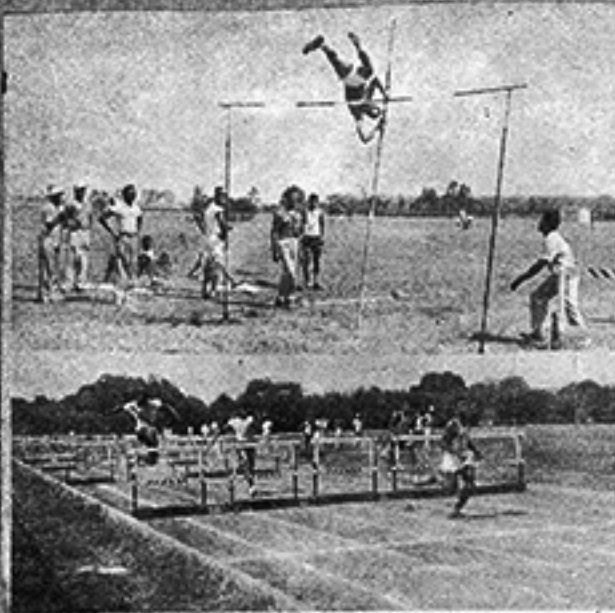

J. S. Clark Edges Boston for State Track Crown

J. S. Clark High School of Opelousas won its first State Track and Field Championship beating out Boston High of Lake Charles 30½ to 27 as three records fell before the finest array of track stars ever assembled in LIALA track history.

Coch Claude Paxton's Opelousas team went into the mile relay trailing Boston 27 to 25 but the jags from St. Landry out-classed the field in the event to finish with 30½ points.

Stiff competition highlighted the '55 track meet as 8 points separated the first 4 teams. The points spread were J. S. Clark of Opelousas 30½; Boston of Lake Charles 27; J. S. Clark of New Orleans 23; and Southern High of Scotlandville 22.

HALL MOST VALUABLE

Hall of J. S. Clark, Opelousas scored 12 points to out-do Jones of Boston for the most valuable award. Hall won the shot put with a heave of 48 feet 10 inches and flipped the discus 37 feet to win these two events. Hall also came in third in the low hurdles as he led his teammates to victory.

Jones of Boston High won the 100 yard dash in 9.3 seconds to erase the old mark of 10 seconds that has stood in the books since '51. Jumping out the 220 yard dash in 21.3 seconds Jones set a new record to erase the old 22 second record of Gager of Cohn set in '51. Coming back in the 440 yard relay Jones was the most outstanding man of the meet.

Sewell of Southern High, high-stepped to a new record in the 120 yard hurdles as he clipped .5 of a second off of the old record of 16 seconds. Sewell put his all into the race and won going away.

Paxton served as chairman of the meet and was also the official starter... Sewell cruised the high hurdles winning on the high boards for the second year in a row... If any other schools would have won the mile relay and the runner up, Boston had the Margin of victory. J. S. Clark of Opelousas was the only school in striking distance of Boston... the 1955 running of the LIALA Track Meet displayed the finest group of High School track and field stars ever assembled.

Two Records Shattered As Landry Wins LIALA Track Championship

Two records were established and another tied in the Fourth Annual running of the Louisiana Inter-scholastic, Athletic and Literary Association's Track and Field Championships held at Southern university last Saturday.

Before a small crowd, 21 prep schools contended for honors on the fast wind-blown track as a new titleholder was crowned. Scoring in 11 of the 14 events, L. B. Landry of New Orleans, a well-balanced squad, was the top team with 53 1/2 points. Second place went to J. S. Clark of Opelousas with 32 5/6 points. Booker Washington of New Orleans with 29 1/2 points was third and a close fourth was Southern High with 27 5/6 points. Cohen High, the champions for the last two years, mustered but 8 1/2 points for a seventh-place finish.

Smashing previous records were Dempsey of Booker T. Washington, New Orleans, who bettered his discus mark of last year by nearly 18 feet when he posted a new-high of 139 1/2 feet; Swayne of Landry and Norwood of Southern tied for the first place in the high jump with a leap of 6' 1". Equalling his own mark of 26.2 in the 220-yard low hurdles was Pierce of Iberville, who scored the only tallies for his team.

Despite the fact that the participants faced a driving-wind, all

former marks came close to being replaced as the high-schoolers vied for the coveted crown.

Scoring 10 1/4 points Shallerhorn of New Orleans' Booker Washington won the individual high-point trophy.

Prior to the start of the finals Willie Rowley, worshipful master and Robert Aulston of Twilight Lodge No. 166 Prince Hall Masons Scotlandville, presented to the game committees chairman Claude Paxton, trophies for winners in each event. These awards were given in addition to the usual medals bestowed by the LIALA.

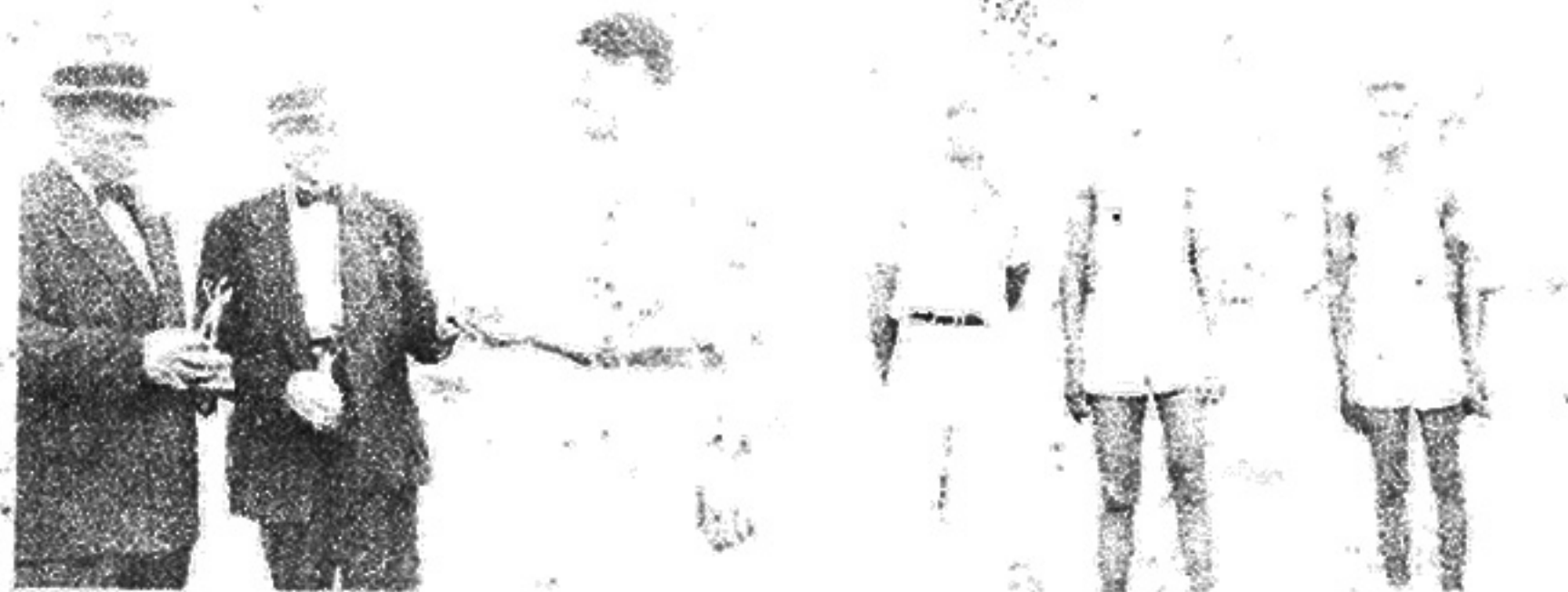

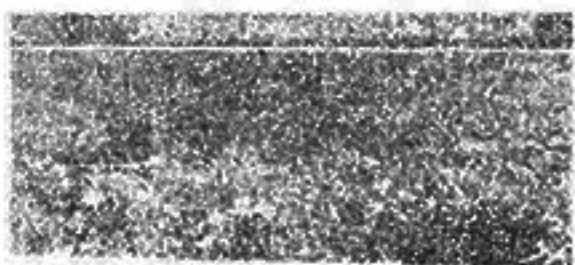

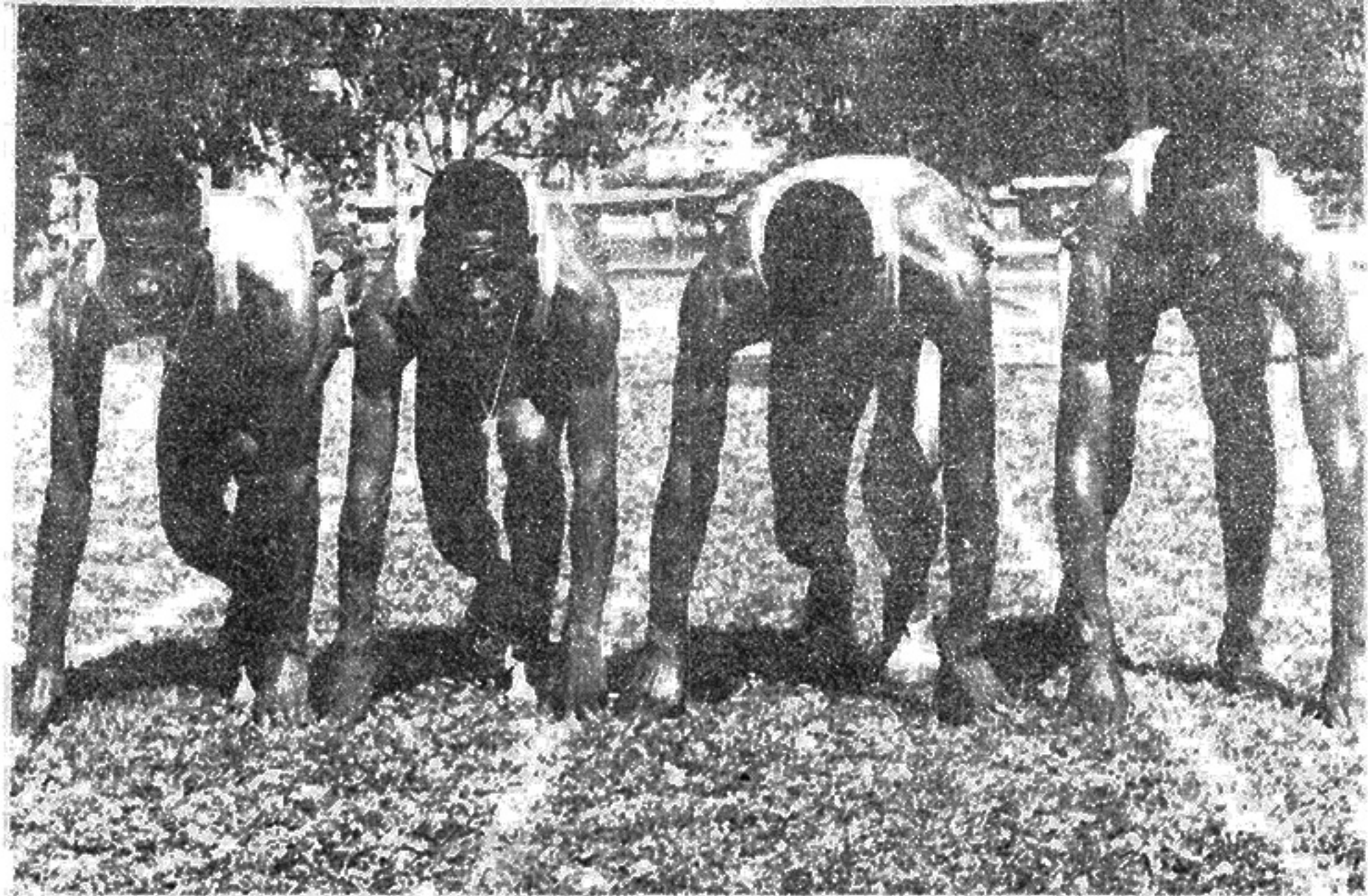

J.S. Clark-Double A State Champs

BATON ROUGE -- Coach Claude Paxton highlighted his tenth year as Head Track Coach at J.S. Clark High School of Opelousas by directing his awesome group of thinclads to their third consecutive double-A statewide championship held here recently.

Paxton's Bulldogs won four firsts, six seconds, three thirds and fourths and one fifth place to stride to a 20-point bulge over 13 competitors.

This was Paxton's fourth state crown in 10 years at Clark's helm.

Only two state records were broken, the most sensational effort being produced by Clark's Douglas Kimble, who sped four laps around the oval in a record-breaking time of four minutes,

thirty and two-tenths seconds.

Carver Rams Win Dillard-Esso Meet **AT 9.5 IN** **DOUGLAS EALY CLOCKED 100**

Douglas Ealy, Xavier Prep's fleet-footed sprinter, recorded a sensational 9.5 in the 100 yard dash as 10 records of the annual Dillard-Esso Invitational High School Track and Field meet were shattered last Saturday afternoon in Dillard's Alumni stadium.

The Carver Rams dethroned the Prep's Yellowjackets as champions of the 5th annual Dillard-Esso spike attraction which featured 15 prep thincad squads, amassing a total of 30 team points.

Speed merchant Ealy's smashing performance in the century dash, according to reports, was the best ever recorded by a Louisiana prep sprinter. Four other performances good enough to re-write the re-

cord books anywhere in the Pelican state, shared the spotlight of Ealy's feat in the 100 which was clocked by four timers at 9.5 and another at 9.4.

Marks were brushed aside in the board jump, mile relay, high jump and 440 yard run and replaced with glit-edged new ones. Bobbie B. West of Landry, broke James "Country" Warren's 1959 mark of 23'2", with a par excellent leap of 23'11". In the high jump, Whardell Coleman of Landry and A. Felton, Cypress Grove orbited over the bar each with leaps of 6'2", to crack B. Williams' 1960 jump of 5'9".

In the other standout record breaks, Carver's foursome sprinted to a 3:23.9 in the mile relay to topple the old meet

record established by Cohen in 1959. Carver's T. Lewis' sizzling 49.3 set a new mark in the 440 yard dash.

Old-records were shoved aside in 880, sprintmedley, Discus, mile run and 440 Relay. In the 880 yard relay, Clark covered the distance in 1:30.1 to best Prep's 1960 mark of 1:33.1,

Scotlandville knocked off two tenths of a second in the sprint medley with a 3:38.2 to erase Cohen's 3:28.4 in '59; W. Brown of Carver, with a toss of 141' 11 1/2" was 8 1/2 inches better than C. Haynes' 1959 record, 141'3". L. Lewis, Clark, of Opelousas covered the mile distance in 4:40.8 and Xavier

Prep's 440 relay team was clocked at 44.1.

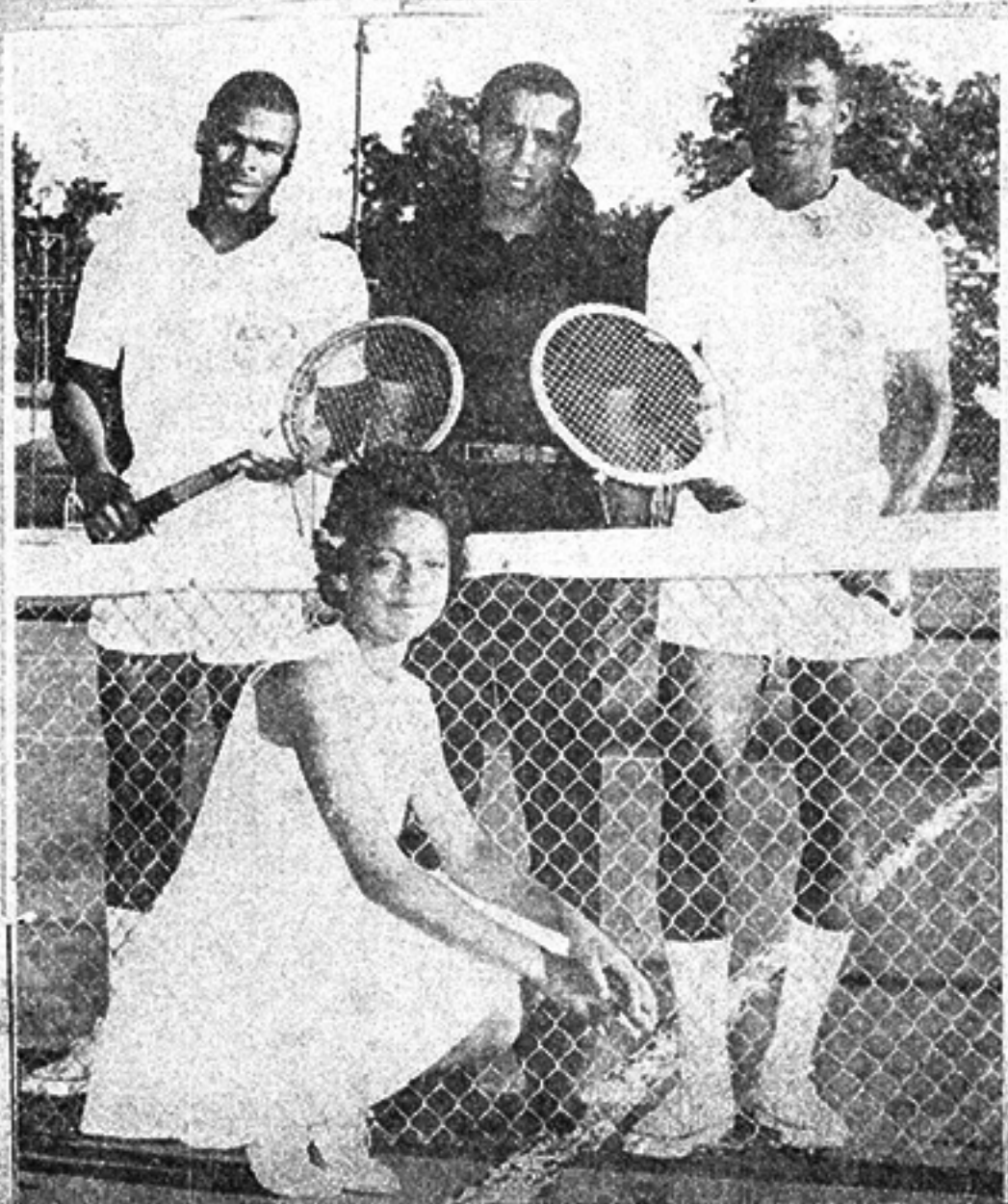

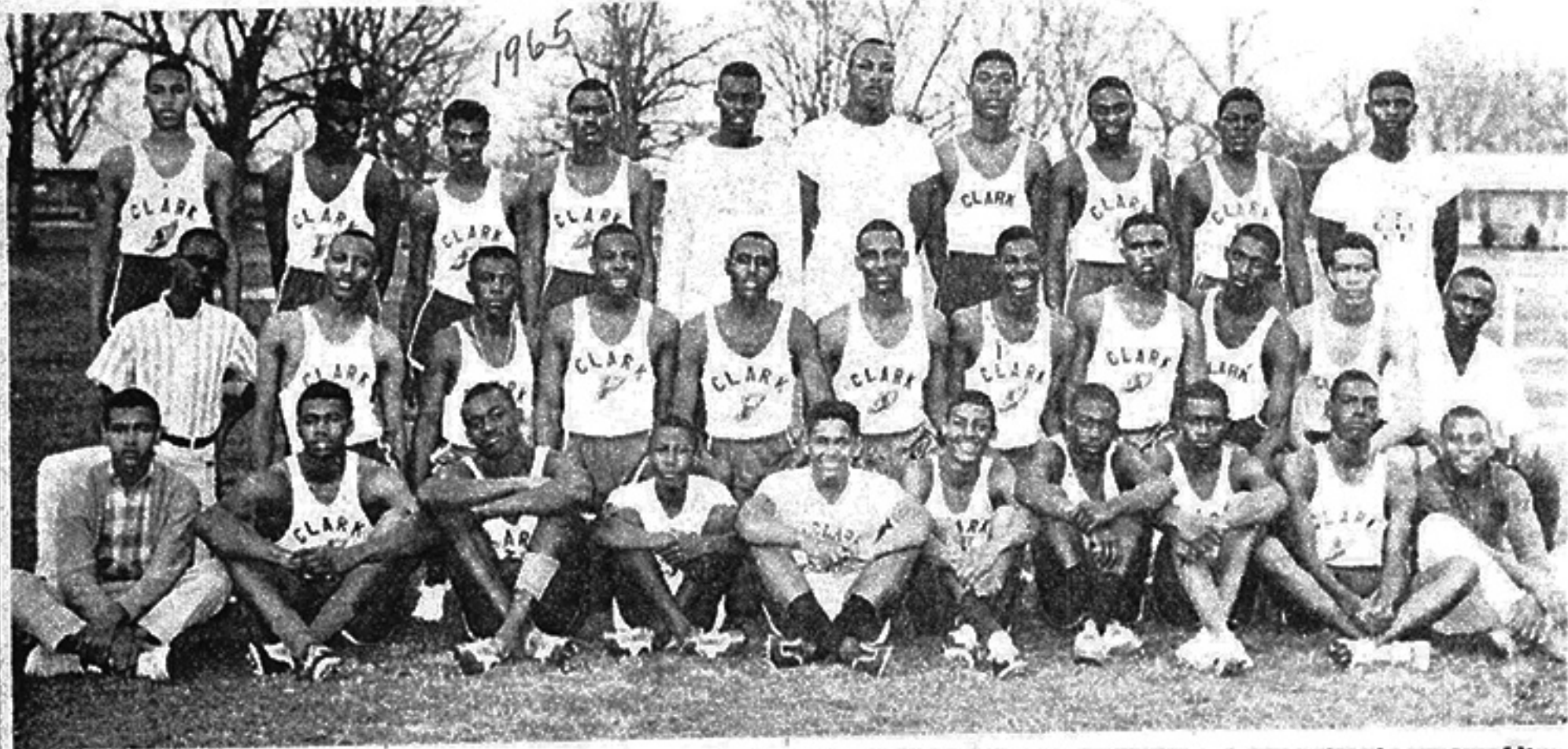

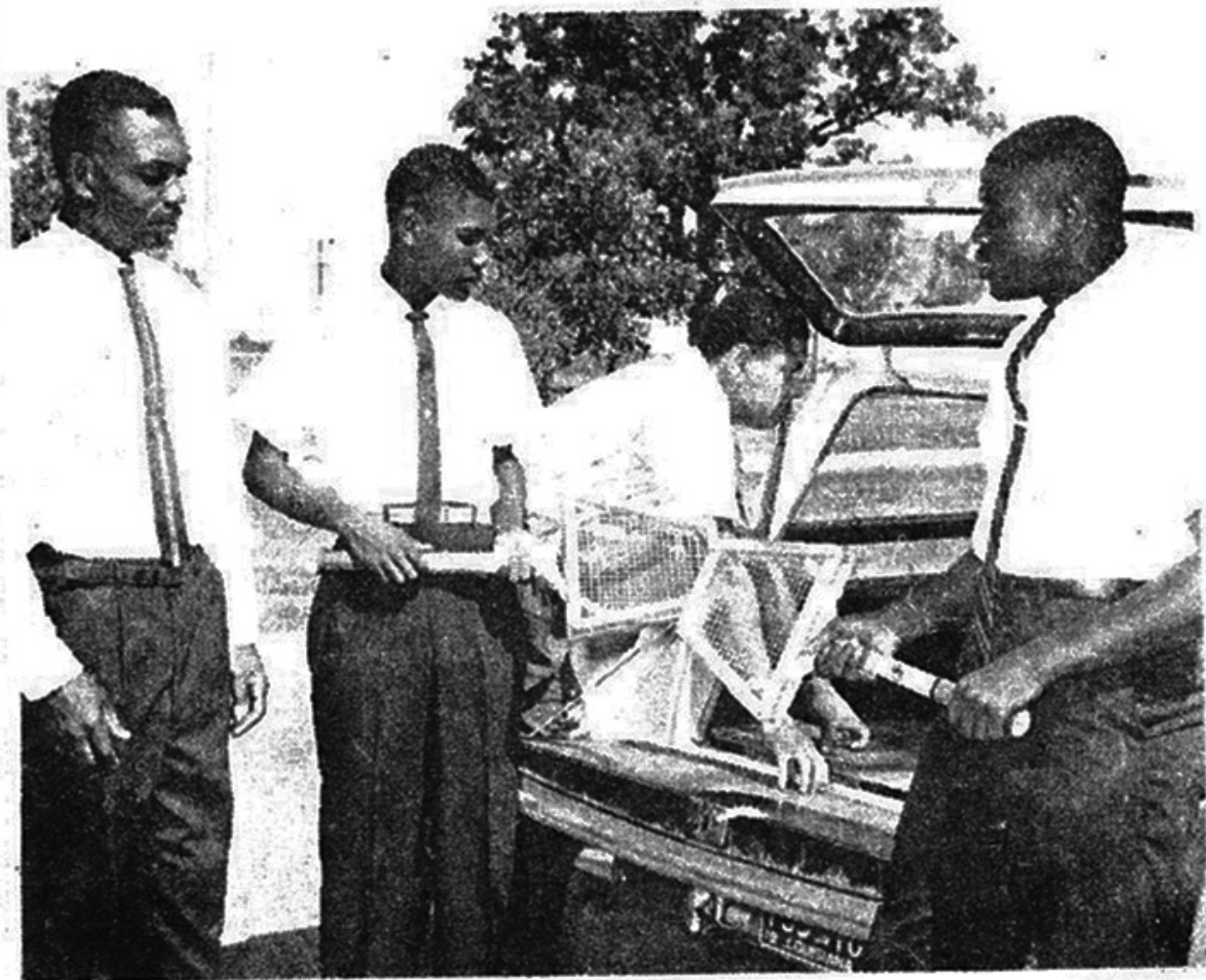

Milburn Ties Mark; Carver Takes Relays 3-29-64

Last year Rodney Milburn was rated one of the best high hurdlers in the nation. Twice he flew over the 120-yard course in 13.9.

This year the J.S. Clark High School senior has to be rated even better — perhaps the best. Saturday night Milburn was timed in 13.5 during the J.S. Clark Relay Carnival. Only two prepsters in the nation have ever been credited with this time.

Bill Tipton recorded a 13.4 but it isn't recognized by the National Federation of Athletics because it was accomplished after the close of the high school track season. Richmond Flowers is recognized as holding the national record of 13.5, set during his 1965 prep season.

Milburn had a 14 flat earlier in the day which easily surpassed the former relay record of 14.3 set by Fulton Lewis of Clark. The second place finisher in the highs wasn't exactly a slouch. Spencer Thomas of Carver of New Orleans leaped the sticks in 13.7. Thomas, probably the finest all-around athlete in the state and one of the most sought after prepsters in the nation, took both the triple jump and long jump with outstanding distances. The hop-step-jump was measured at 48-0 and the long jump was marked off at 22-9.

Milburn is a senior eligibility and will be graduated next February. At that time his services will be highly sought.

Behind Thomas' sterling effort, Carver of New Orleans took the meet title with 68 points. There were 28 teams competing under shiny skies and with no wind. McKinley of Baton Rouge and Landry of New Orleans had a close battle for second with 51 and 50 points respectively. The point totals then dropped. Fourth place Lincoln of New Orleans was fourth with 29 points and Clark of New Orleans was fifth with 27. Scotlandville of Baton Rouge was sixth with 26 and the J.S. Clark team captured seventh with 24 points.

Several records were established during the event. The Carver of New Orleans mile relay team toured the track in 3:21.2, which is one of the best times recorded in the state this year. Lloyd Willis ran the final leg in an unbelievable 47.9.

Joe Sincere of Martyn set a new record in the century with a 9.6 timing. The old record was set in 1955. Don Buffington toured the furlong in 21.5 which surpassed the old mark of 22.1. Lester Vallet ran the half in 2:02.9 to surpass the old mark of 2:03.0.

Sylvester Bates of Lincoln

was busy setting records in a couple field events. Bates' 54-6 in the shot bested the old mark of 52-7 3-4 and his 158-8 1-4 was better than the old discus record of 148-8.

Louisiana's high school track and field season is about six weeks old now, so times and distances are beginning to reach the respectable level.

Negro athletes, in the LIALO, are dominating the speed events, while LHSAA members control the distances and most of the field events.

Top performance this season was the 13.5 high hurdles run by Rodney Milburn of J. S. Clark High in Opelousas. This broke the all-time Louisiana record of 13.8, set by Minden's Jimmy Upton in 1967. It also matched the national record, but Milburn is not eligible for recognition since Clark High is not a member of the national federation.

Louisiana's most versatile prep track and field athlete is Spencer Thomas (pictured) of New Orleans Carver. Thomas ran 13.7 behind Milburn's record-shattering hurdles race; leads in the triple jump with a 48-0 leap and is third in the long jump, which he controlled last year and probably will again before this season is out.

SAHUQUE NO. 1

The No. 1 distance man is, not Fair Park's John McKinnon, but little Bobby Sahuque of New Orleans Redemptorist. Bobby has the best mile time, 4:13.5, achieved in upsetting McKinnon in the Bolton Relays, and also leads in the 880-yard run with a 1:54.4 clocking.

The LIALO performers have both run the fast times ever for Louisiana Prepsters, with Milburn owning a 13.5 and Thomas 13.7. And in the Pelican State Relays here last Saturday, Milburn ran a 14.1 over college height hurdles with Thomas taking a 14.2 second place.

In the zone championship, Milburn won the 120s in 13.8, and came back to post a 19.0 victory in the 180-lows, the former for a new zone record. The 19.0 tied the record.

Thomas is regarded as one of the finest all-around prep tracksters in the nation.

An example of his prowess was evident last week in the zone championships when he won the triple jump with a 47-3

effort, bettering the old record, and won the long jump with a leap of 22-7½ in addition to his second place finish in the high hurdles.

Sahuque won the 880-yard run by six yards with a timing of 1:55.1 and the mile with clocking of 4:17.3.

The fans showed Sahuque how they appreciated his performance as they gave him a standing ovation as he pulled away from the field during the last 220 yards to win by over 50 yards.

The high jump ended in a deadlock between Joe Kopfler of Baton Rouge and Ray Worthy of Scotlandville. Both cleared the bar at six feet. Kopfler was declared the winner with fewer misses.

Ken Addy of Lee took the shot by edging Sylvester Bates of Lincoln with a toss of 57-0. Garland Saire of Erath was third with a toss of 53-4.

The javelin was won by St. Paul's Bruce Garrett with a toss of 191-2½. Dick Wriborg of Iota was second as he threw the javelin 186-8½.

Elwood Stevens of Opelousas, Richard Lewis of Natchitoches and Mark Wiegand of DeRidder ended in a tie in the pole vault with leaps of 13-6. Stevens had fewer misses and was declared the winner.

Milburn Gets ¹⁹⁶⁹ Invitation to Golden Meet

Rodney Milburn, J.S. Clark's sensational hurdler, has been invited to take part in the 10th Annual Golden West Invitational Track and Field Meet. The invitation is a tremendous honor for the Opelousas athlete.

Only the eight best seniors in each event from across the nation are invited to take part. Not too many Louisiana athletes have ever been invited. Milburn is the second J.S. Clark athlete to be given an invitation. Aaron Thompson, an outstanding sprinter now running for LSU, took a third place in the meet a few years past.

Clark coach Claude Paxton received a call Saturday morning from Reggie Young, coordinator for this five-state area. Thus far three Louisiana athletes have been officially invited: Milburn; Mr. Everything, Spencer Thomas of Carver of New Orleans; and Bobby Salague of New Orleans, Redemptorist High who ran a 4:06.4 prep mile at the AAA meet Friday in Hoama which is the best time in the history of the state and the best in the nation this year.

The meet is staged on a Saturday in Sacramento, Calif. There will be eight athletes in each event, with all events being finals.

Clark track coach Paxton has asked if the City of Opelousas might aid in sending Milburn to the event. When Thompson made the trip the bill totalled approximately \$500 and this is

the school's goal this year. Paxton and J.C. Mason will be attempting to solicit funds. Anyone wishing to donate by mail can simply mail a check in care of the high school.

Only one Louisiana trackster was a participant last year - Al Coffee. The LSU ace won the 220-yard dash and finished third in the century.

Over the 120-yard high hurdles Milburn has recorded a 13.5, the best prep time in the nation and the second best time in prep history. It is an unofficial time because the National Federation doesn't recognize the LIALO. He had a 13.6 in winning the state AAA LIALO Meet and being named "Outstanding Trackman." He also had a 13.7, 13.8 and 13.9 this season.

His talents don't end there. He has recorded an 18.9 in the low hurdles. He has a 9.8 century. And he has run legs on 440 and 880 winning relays. He has been invited to run the hurdles but could just about run anything.

"It was beautiful - beautiful all the way," exclaimed coach Claude Paxton. The J.S. Clark High School coach used these words to describe the performance of Rodney Milburn at the Golden West Invitational Track and Field Meet this weekend. He accompanied the Clark senior on the trip.

MILBURN TURNED in a 13.4 high hurdles win. The clocking, ironically, only tied the meet record. Bill Tipton, the national record holder, set his mark while competing in the Sacramento meet. Milburn also competed in the 330 intermediate hurdles while staying out of the lows. Paxton explained the reasoning behind the choice of events. "Rodney had a 37.7 in the 330's and the meet record was 36.6. We figured that he would have a good chance of breaking the record." As things turned out the senior ran fourth in 39.1.

"He tightened up just a little on the last two hurdles," explains the coach. "He was right up there in front of the pack until that time." One big reason Milburn didn't enter the low hurdles is because the meet record is a fantastic 18.3 and his best is an 18.7 (best in Louisiana this year). As things turned out, the lows were taken in 18.8.

Pole Vault

THE OUTSTANDING athlete in the meet was Casey Carrigan of Orting, Washington. He pole vaulted 17-4 1/2. Who can dispute that selection? The coach also noted that the triple jump was really a tremendous event to watch. Spencer Thomas of New Orleans and Zach Gillon of Peekskill, N.Y. staged a seesaw battle with the lead exchanging hands several times. The New Yorker won the event on his final leap.

The running competition was held on a clay track and grass-tex spikes worked well. One major problem at the meet was the college coaches. According to Paxton, they really kept after some of the great prepsters present. Can't blame them though - it's their living. Milburn added a few more offers to his list.

The school asked to express, through this media, their appreciation of the many donations made by the people of this area to the school. "The trip would never had been possible without a lot of help from everyone," said coach Earl Guilbeau. A total of \$560 was donated to the school.
