Class Day, the event that all seniors looked anxiously forward to, was quickly upon us.

The Junior-Senior Prom was an affair worth mentioning and remembering with all of its gaiety and beauty.

We had begun practicing our songs for graduation, and this awakened us to the realization that graduation was near at hand. Looking back on the past three years, we realized that we were proud that we were a part of Boston. And as we, the warriors, leave Boston, the things that we will remember most are the friends we have made; the members of the faculty along with the principal who helped us with our extremely numerous problems, and the wonderful times we have enjoyed here at our dear old Alma Mater.

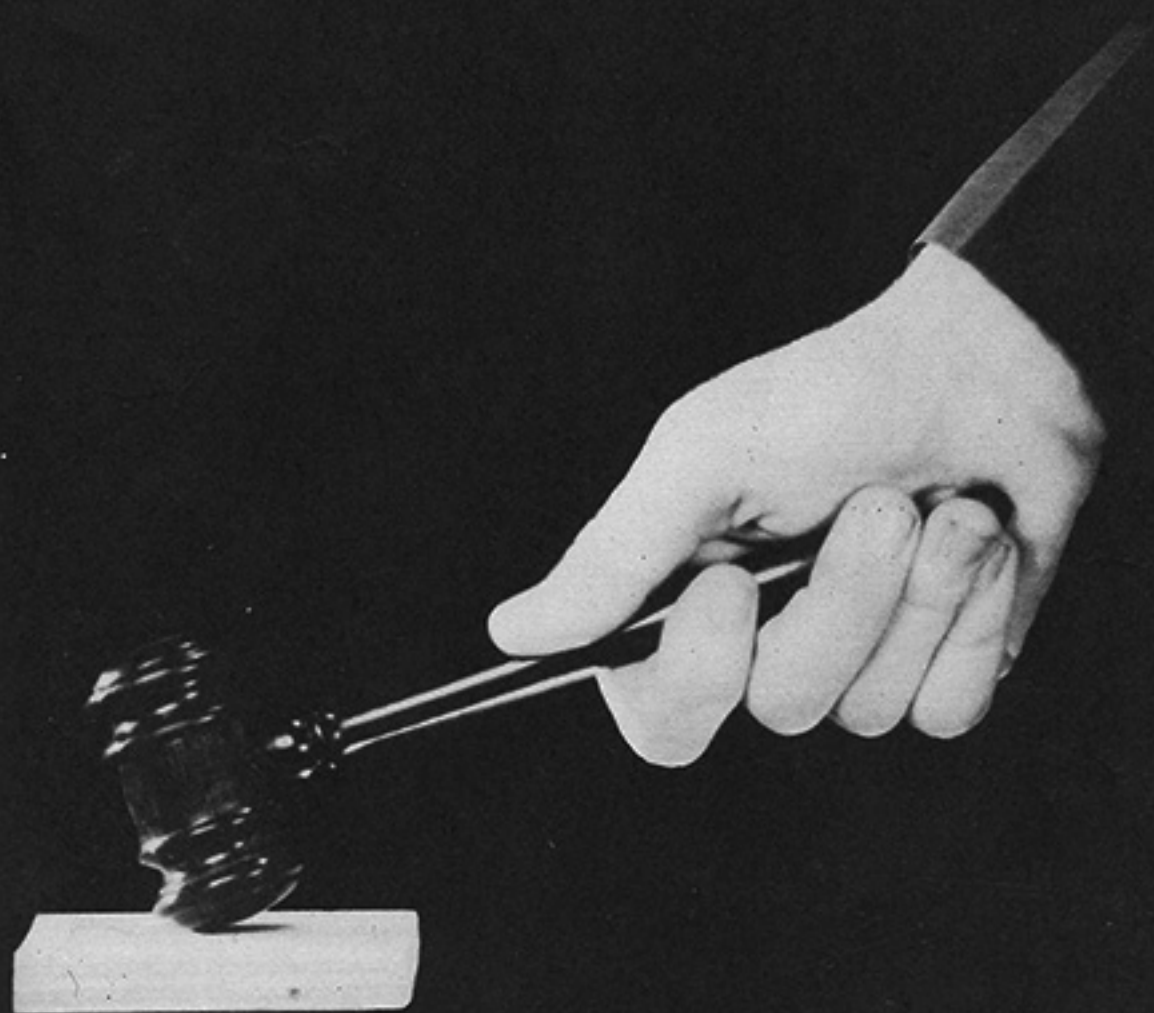
