Fortunate indeed is the teacher who can command such perfect attention from his students. Mr. Marcel Pratt has done just that.




Advanced Math

Mr. Pratt and Cynthia prove that Advanced Math is interesting BUT hard. As one student said, "Its fun after you get to know how to do it."




Civics


Singing - Music


