

- 2nd Black Assistant Superintendent Rapides Parish School System

Walter Hadnot

- Longtime educator in Rapides Parish
- Assistant Principal at Jones Street Junior High
- Principal at Lincoln Road Primary
- President of the Colored Teachers Credit Union (now Rapides Federal Credit Union)
- Very strong academic leadership

Melford & Rosa Jones

- He and his wife were longtime educators in Lecompte
- Teacher/coach at Carter C. Raymond High School, she was the assistant principal
- Candidate for Rapides School Board
- Lecompte Town Council, Rosa is the Mayor
- Visionary leaders and organizer for the Lecompte Rosenwald/Carter C. Raymond School reunion.


