

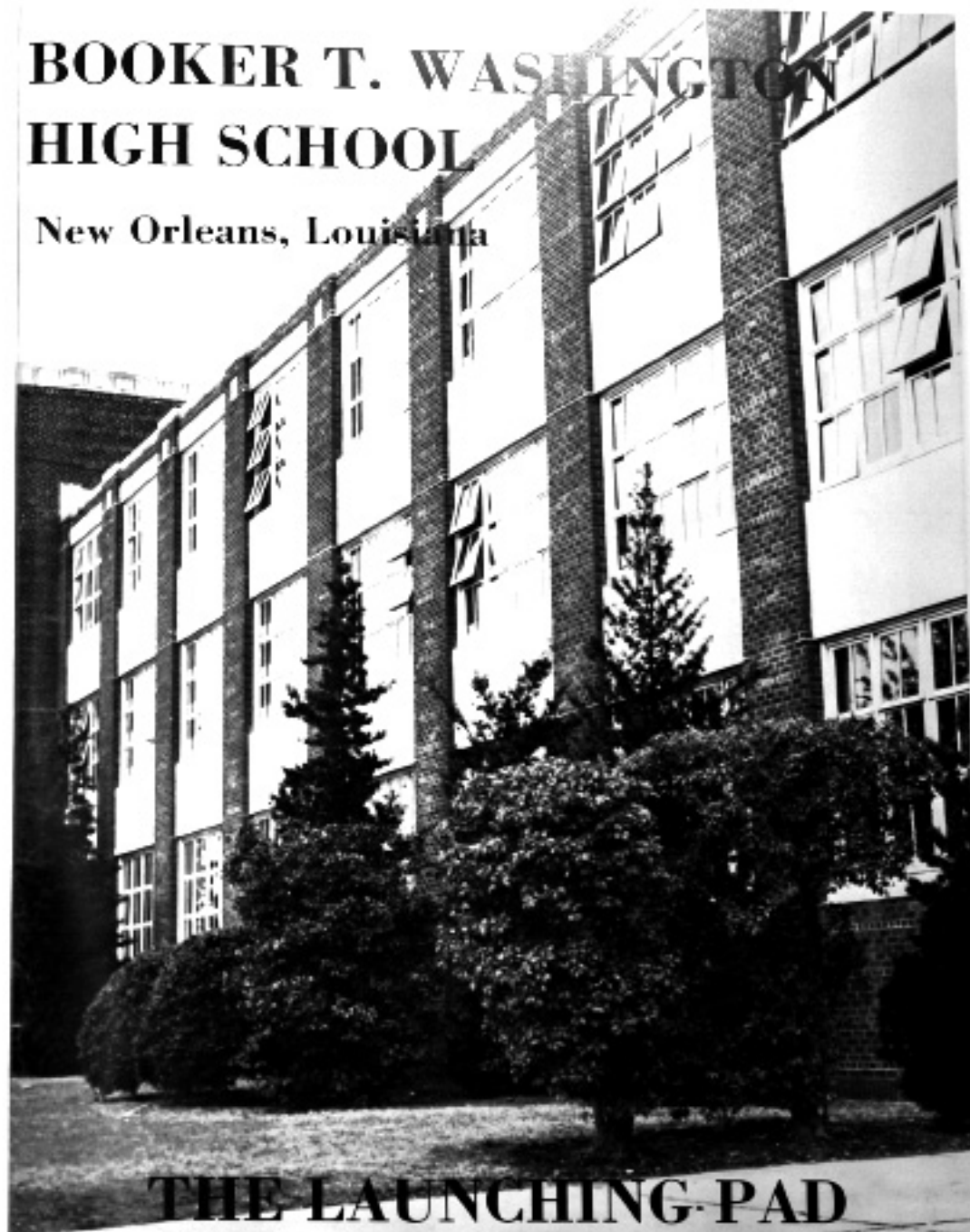

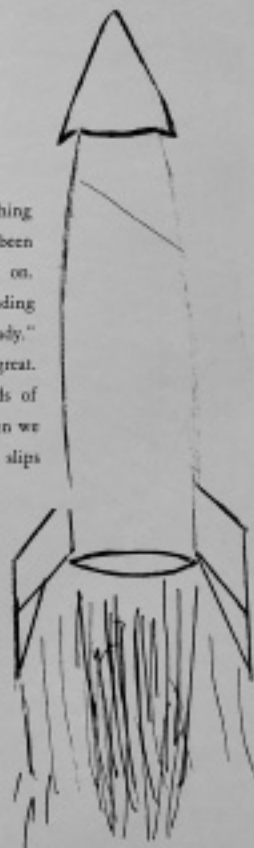

Mr. Norris possessed a dynamic personality, and was a deep thinker and dedicated teacher. His students and friends respected his opinions.

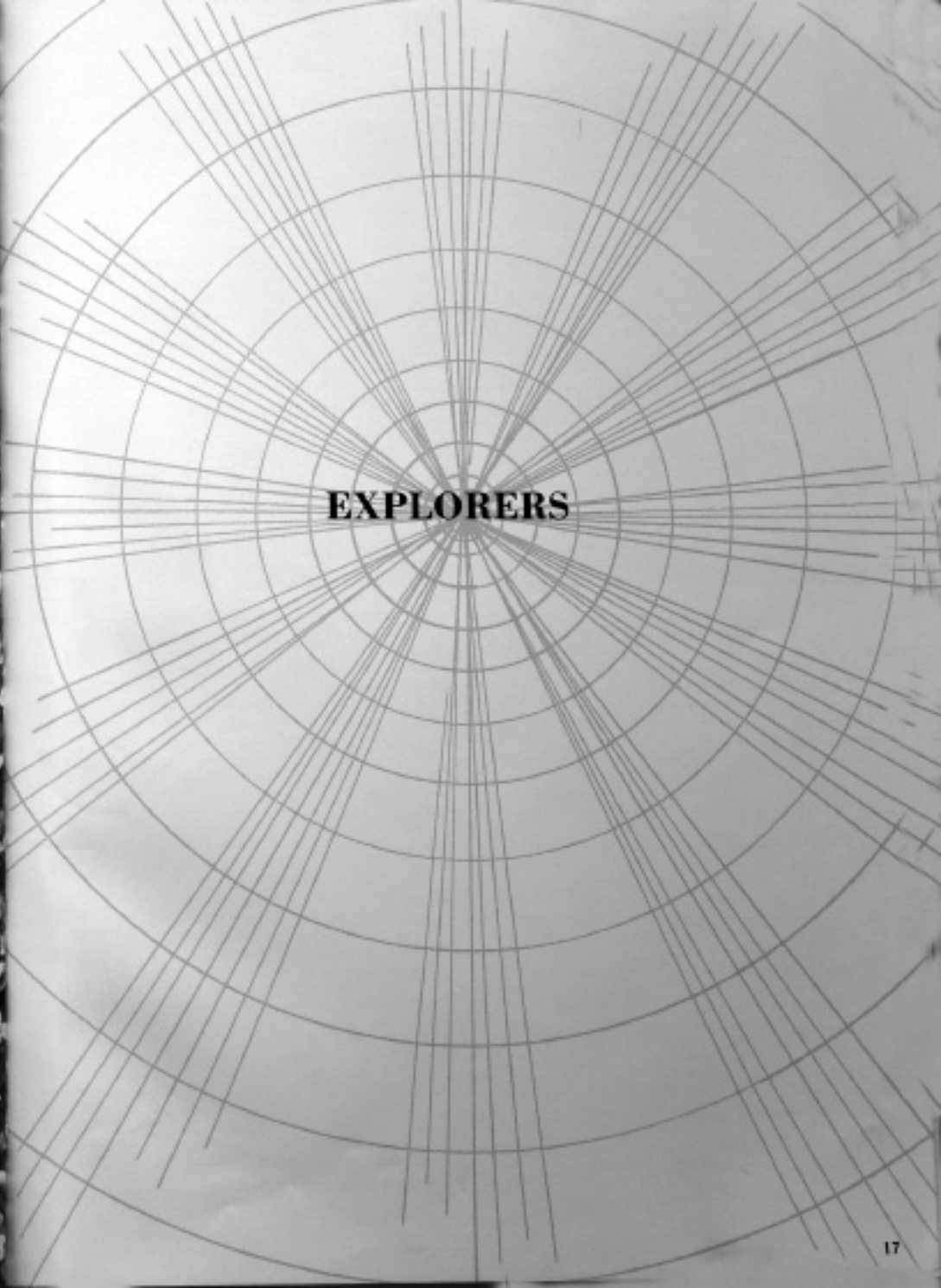
We wish for Mr. Norris eternal rest, and quote a stanza of Requiem applicable to the life he impressed on us as he went about his way:

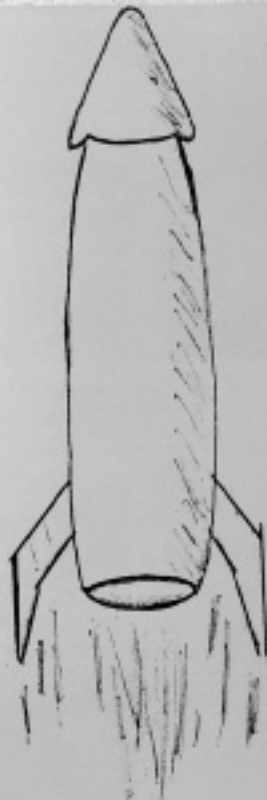

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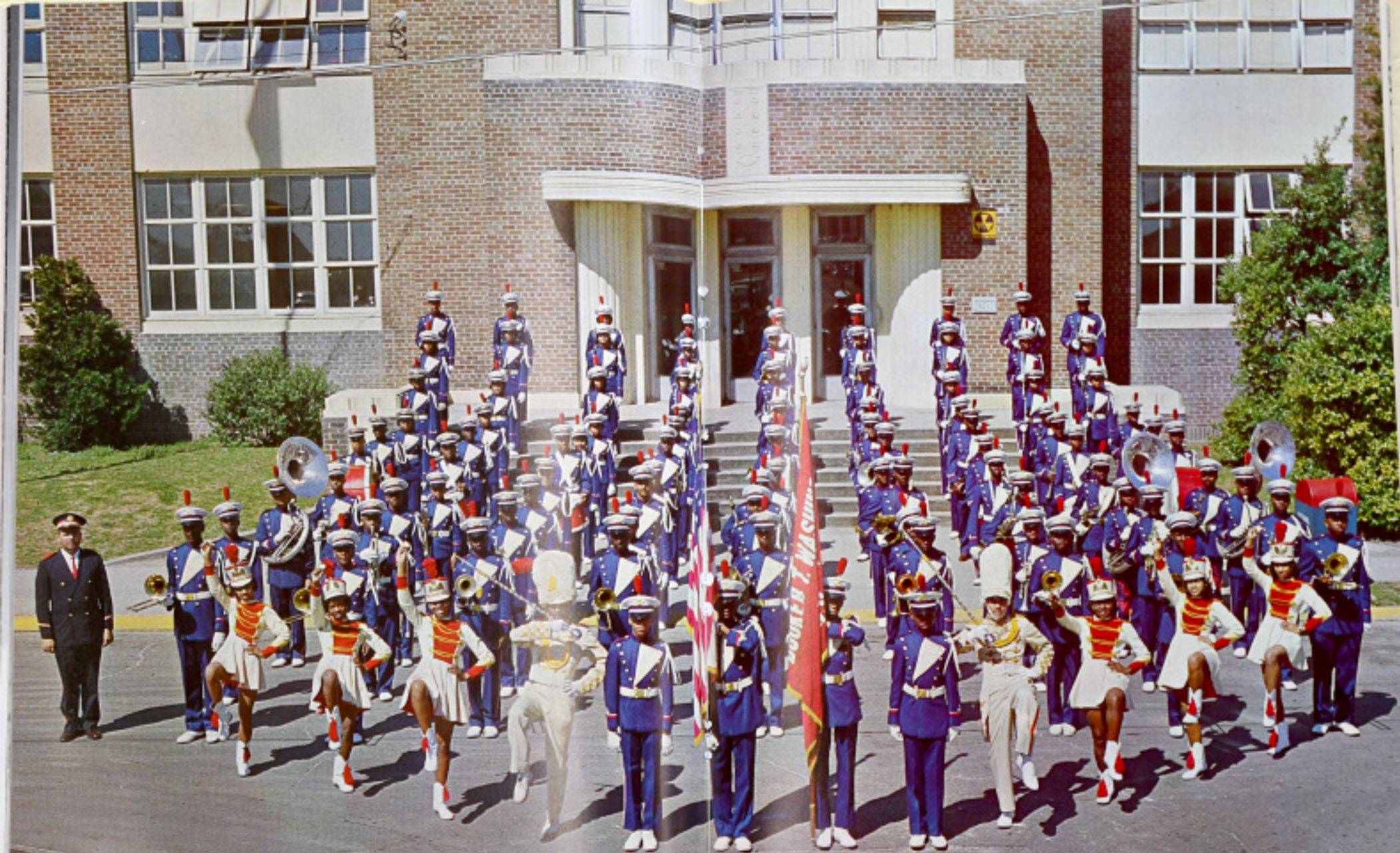

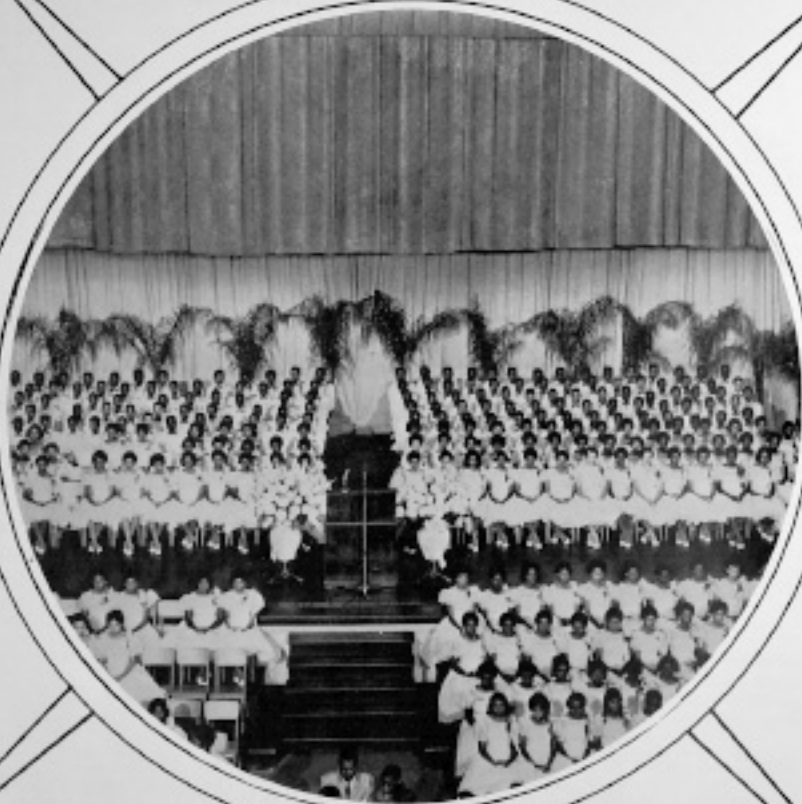
