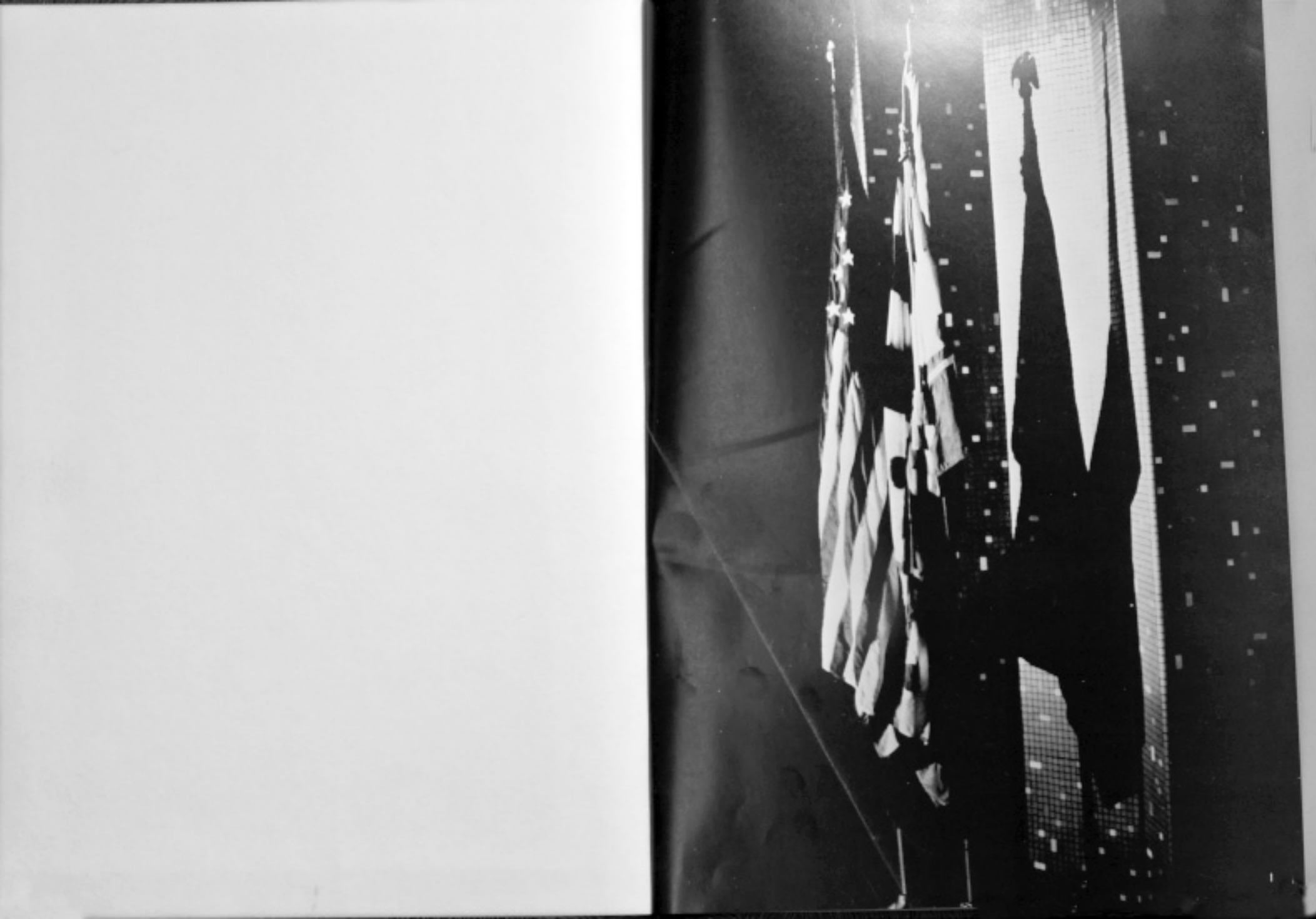
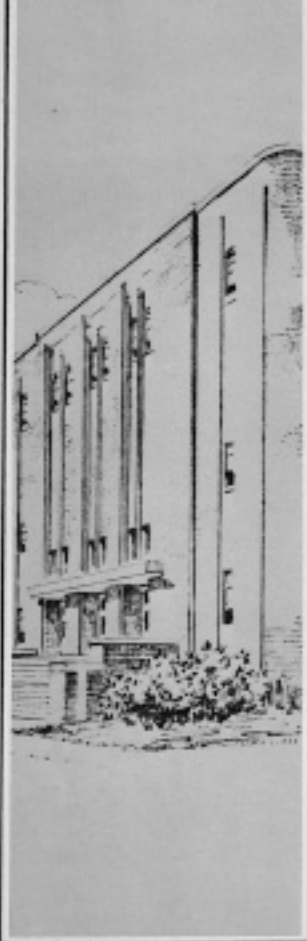

FOREWORD

Twenty-two years ago, Booker T. Washington, one of the two comprehensive high schools in New Orleans, opened its doors to the city's children who were interested in trades as well as college education.

While the million-dollar structure was highly acceptable to the population it was to serve, the trade offerings were not wholly because the people, at that time, could not envision a world of automation - an age of skills with industrial plants like the Boeing plant of the Chrysler Corporation. However, a few brave souls, mainly the principal and some faculty members, who believed in the school's worth, courageously plodded ahead, developing as they went along ideals and goals that have been lasting: champion football, basketball and track teams; honor society, honor days, Career Clinics and Yearbooks that have tended to recreate the atmosphere of B.T.W. twenty-two years ago.

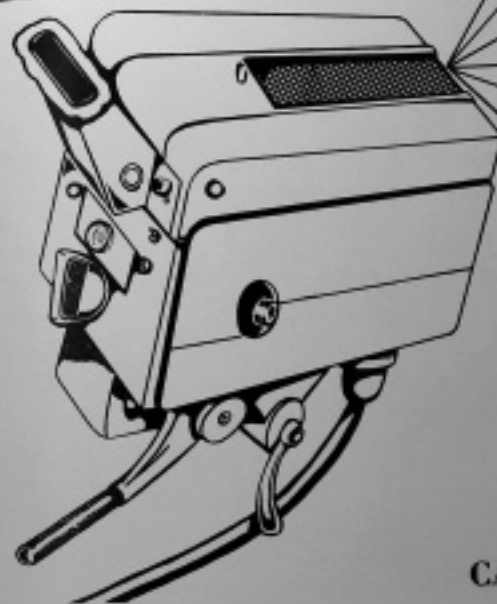

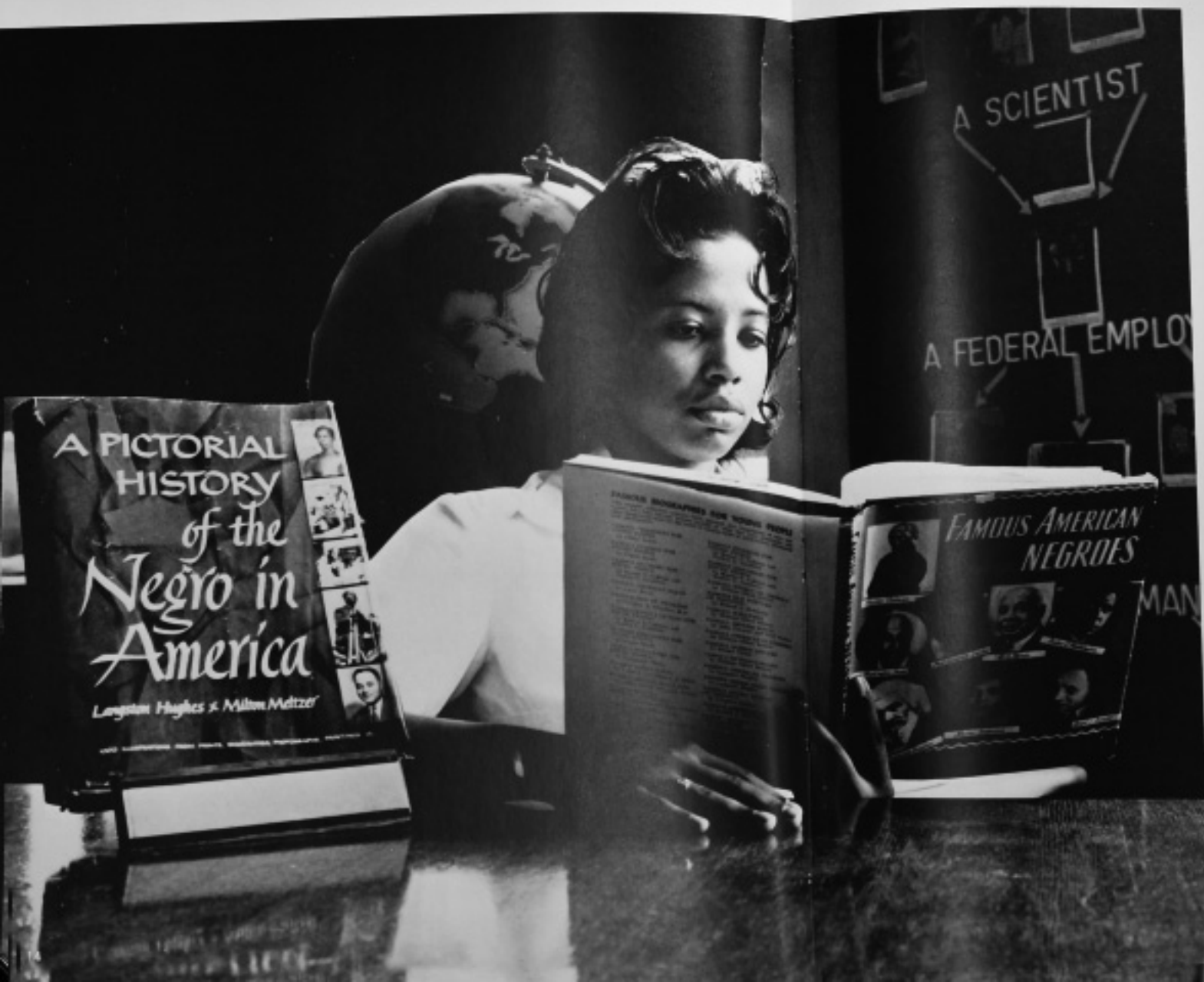


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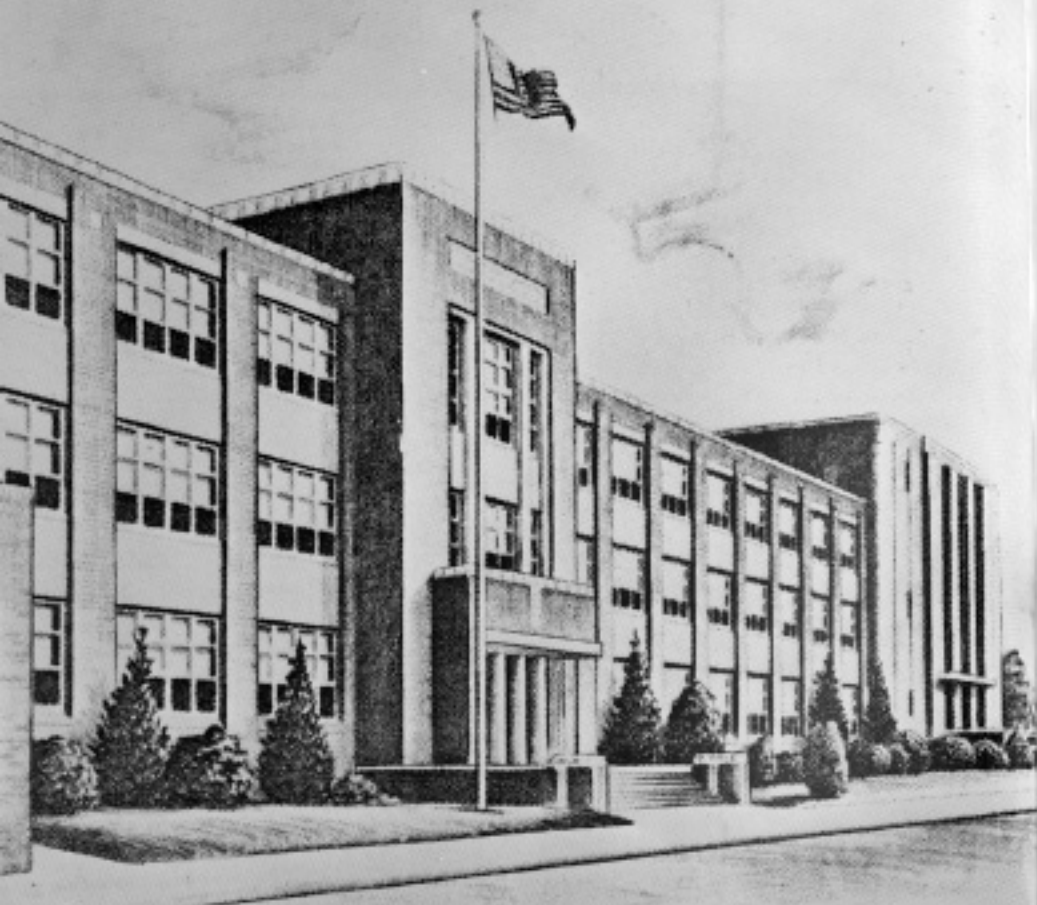

Moreover, he'll live in peace with his friends,

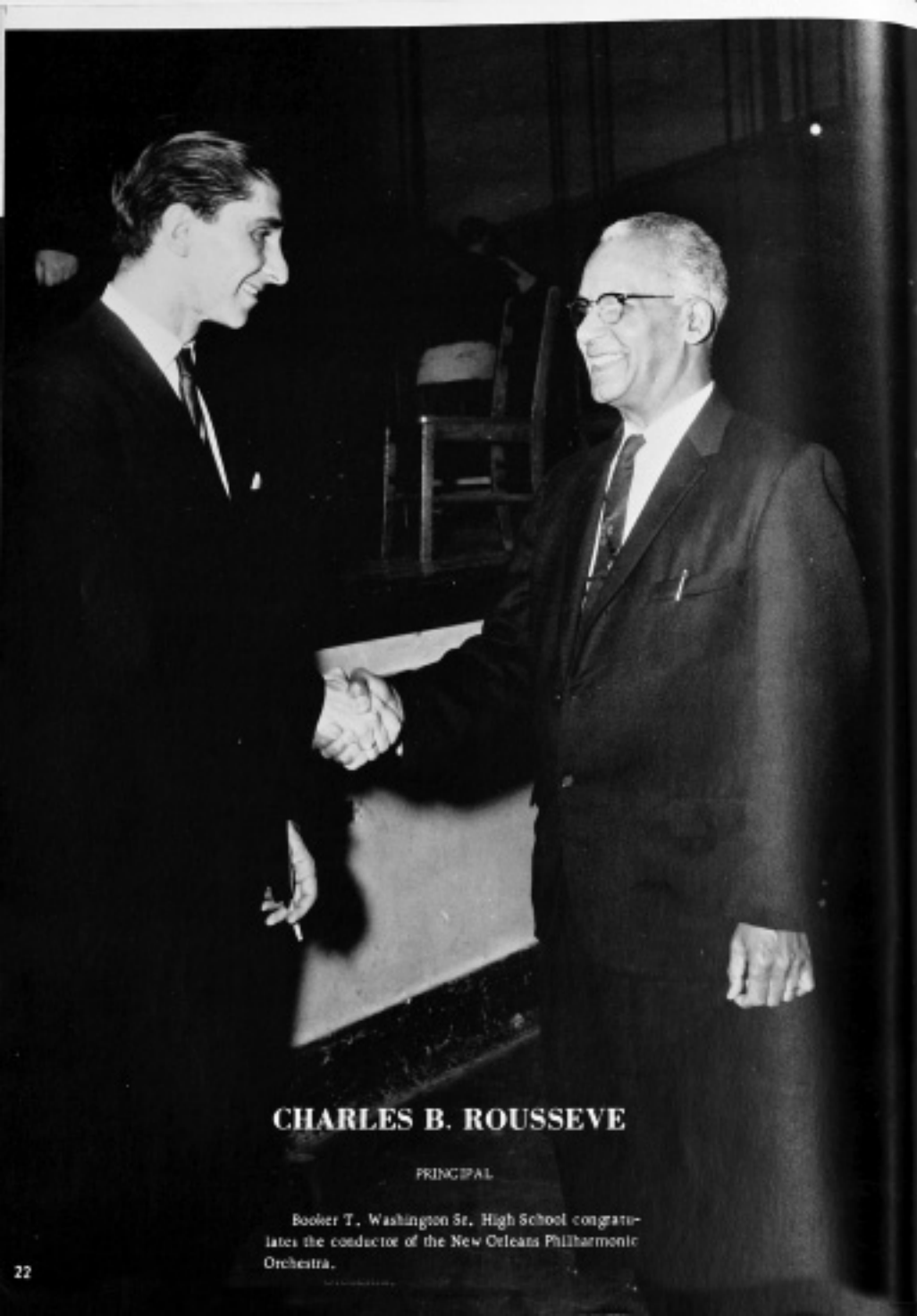
