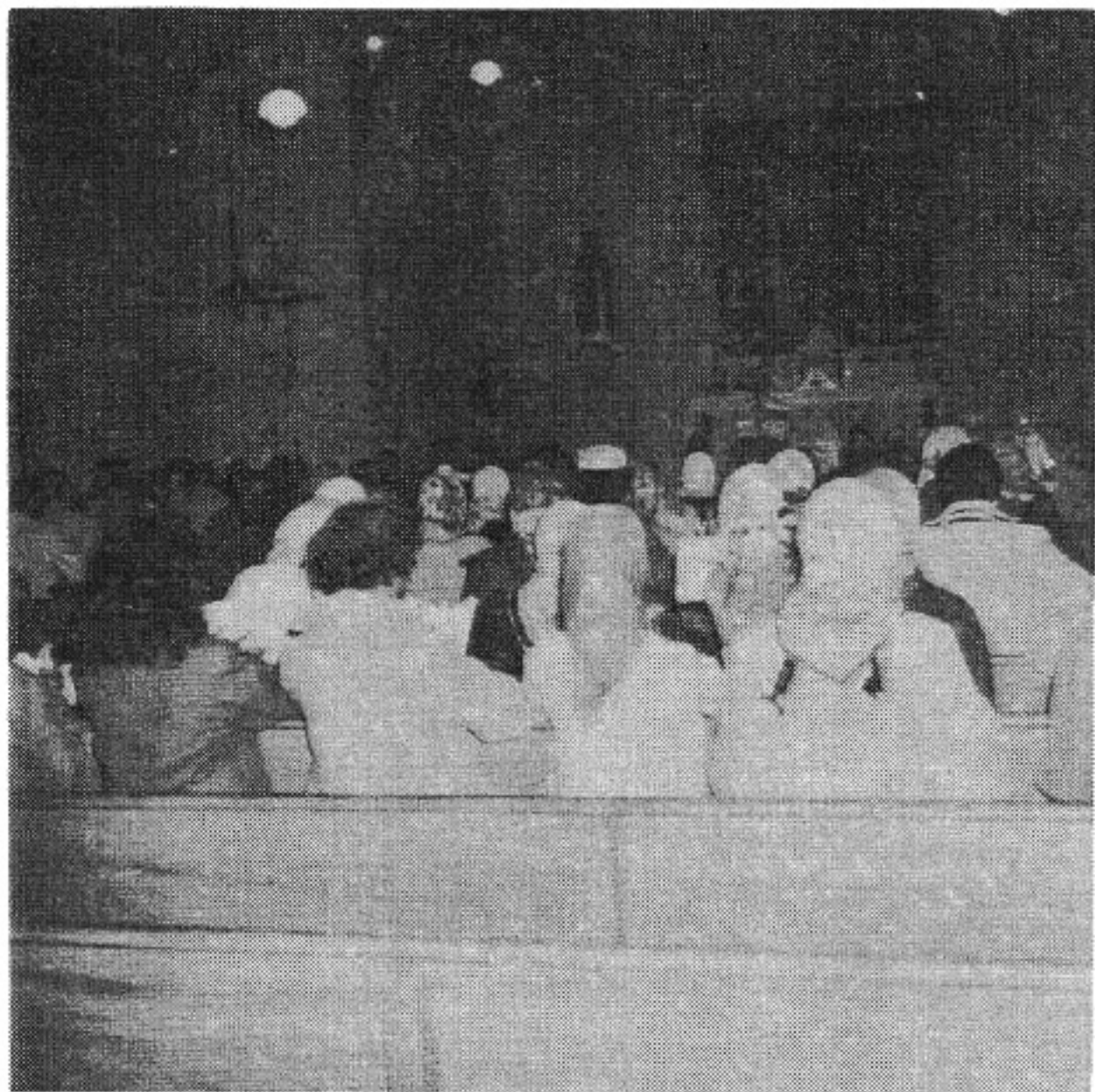






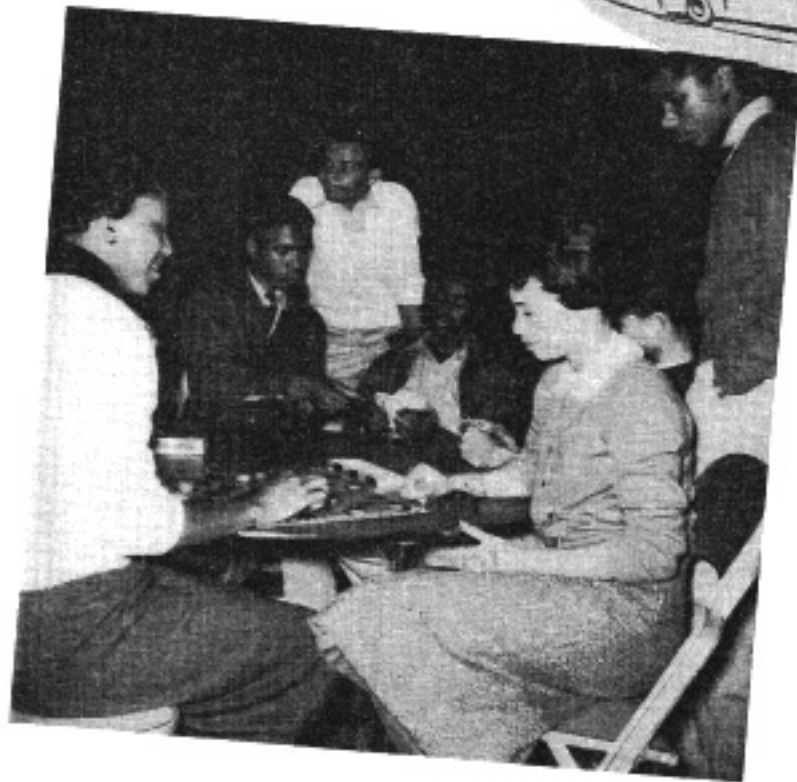

A DAY TO REMEMBER

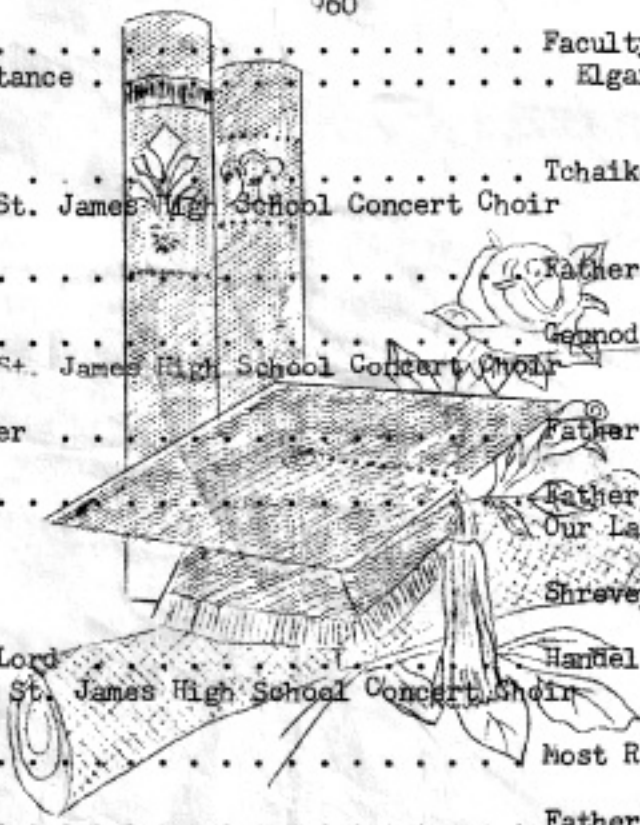

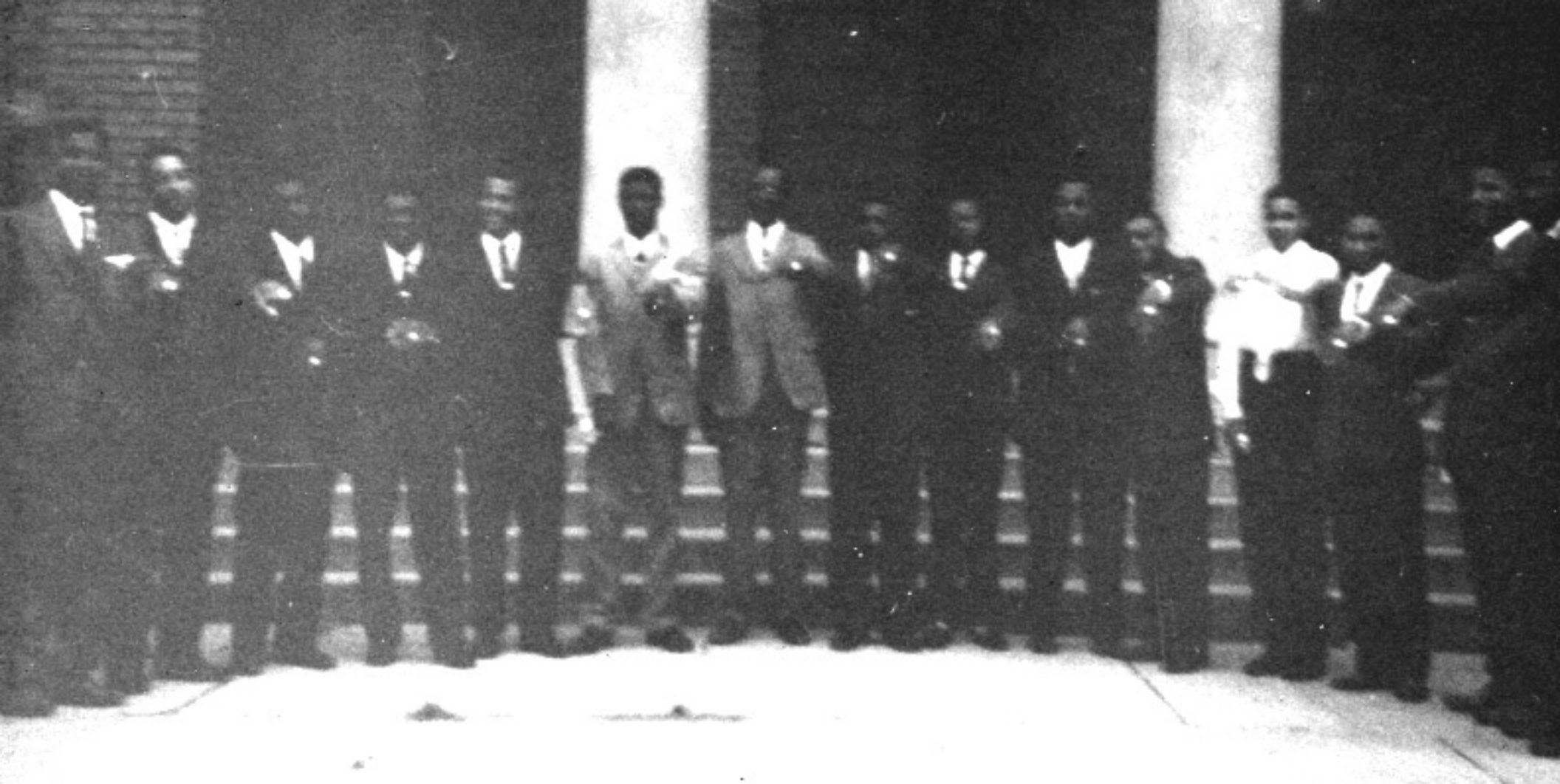
