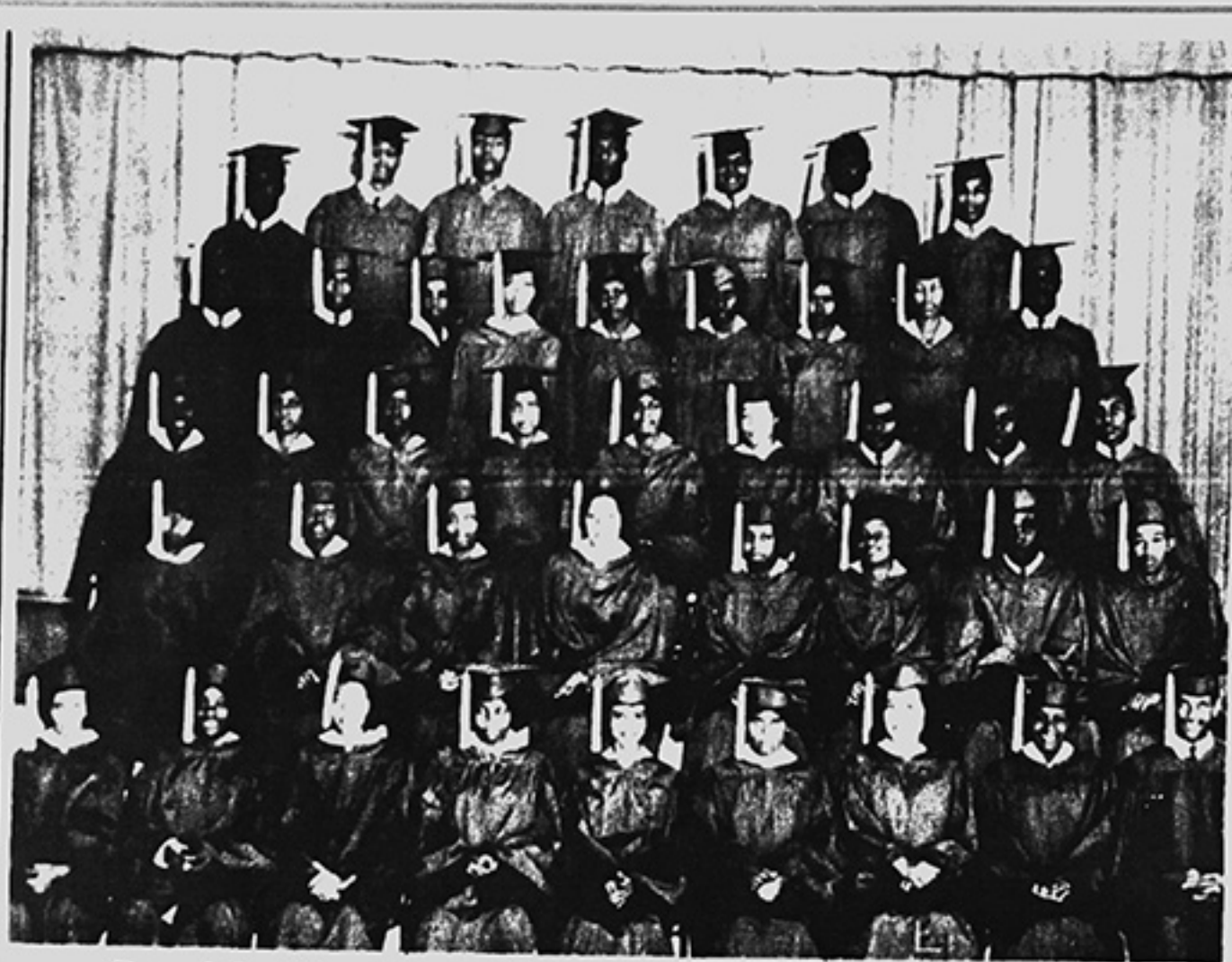

Other officers elected were Lionel Stewart, secretary; Edward Taylor, treasurer; Dianne Milburn, parliamentarian.

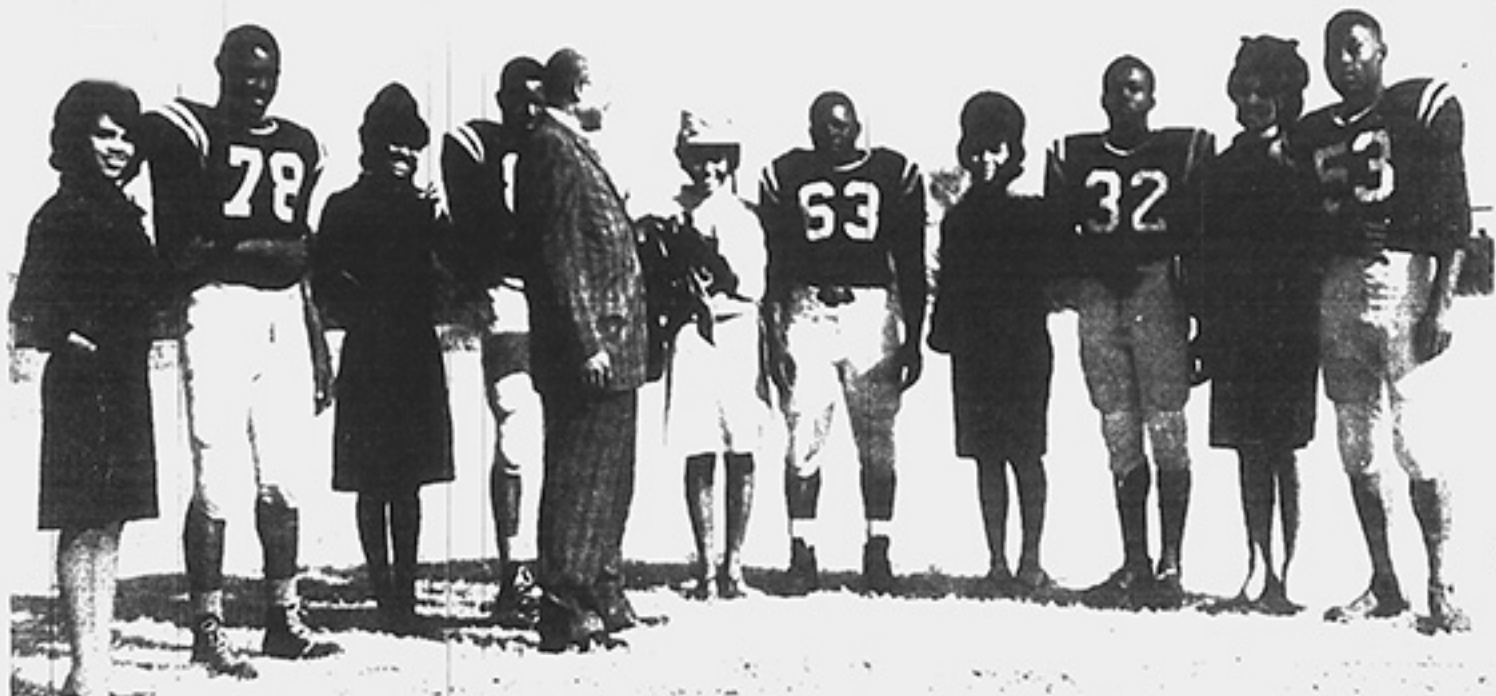

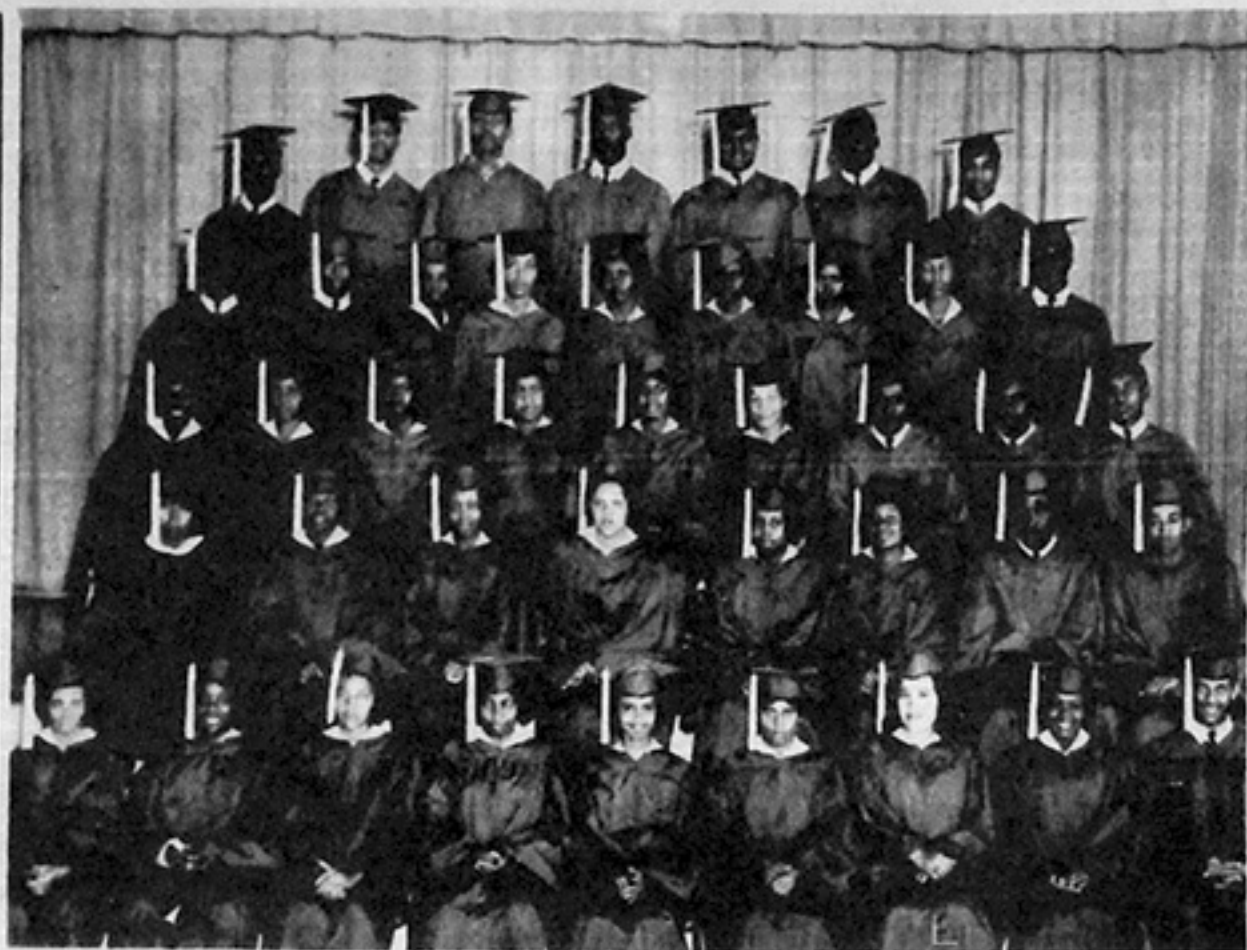

Southern Given Grants to Hold Summer Program

Southern University has received more than a half-million dollars this past semester for research, institutes and instruction to youth in an Upward Bound Project for the coming summer session. Dr. Felton G. Clark, president, announced Monday.

Dr. Clark, said the grants which have come to Southern to offer summer institutes for professional training of in-service teachers are direct results of the faculty and college deans in a program of excellence and confidence in the university by the donors.

The president said over \$70,000 of the grants are for specific research by individual faculty members and students for advanced study and about \$12,000 is for special equipment to facilitate material and supply needs.
