Bethune's First Principal Albert M. Moody



Born on December 13, 1917 in Darlington, LA Albert M. Moody, Sr. was the oldest of nine children born to James N. Moody, Sr and Rosetta Hall Moody. His parents later relocated their family to Baton Rouge, LA Mr Moody attended public schools in Baton Rouge and graduated from McKinley High School. In 1935 Mr. Moody enrolled as a freshman at Southern University. He pledged Omega Psi Phi Fraternity and remained an active member until his death on November 25, 2006. Mr Moody graduated from Southern University in 1939 with a double major in chemistry and mathematics. He later went on to receive his Masters in Science from Teachers College, Columbia University. Mr. Moody served as Asst. Dean of Men at Southern University after graduating from Southern University.

Mr. Moody served for four and a half years in the United States Army. He continued to serve in the Army Reserve and upon his retirement from the Reserves had obtained the rank of Lt. Colonel.

Mr. Moody's first job was as Teacher/Principal of Mulatto Bend Elementary School in West Baton

Rouge Parish. Mr. Moody married his college sweetheart. Estella Martin on May 31, 1941. His wife was from Keithville, La. After several years of marriage the couple relocated to Shreveport, LA. Mr. Moody continued his teaching career at Central Colored High School in Shreveport as a Mathematics Teacher. In 1950. Mr. Moody was appointed to teach Mathematics at Booker T. Washington High School.

In 1954 Mr. Moody was appointed to serve as Principal of Hollywood Elementary School. He served there with excellence and was then appointed Principal of Bethune High School in 1961. Bethune was a high school from 1961- 1973. Bethune became a middle school in 1973. Mr. Moody served as Principal of Bethune Middle School until his retirement in May 1983.

In 1960 Mr. Moody was the recipient of the "Educator of the Year Award" presented by The Shreveport Times and The Caddo Teachers Association. Mr. Moody received numerous awards for excellence and leadership during his lifetime. He was Lay Leader and Chairman of the Board for his church St. Paul United Methodist Church for many years.

in 1963 Mr. Moody founded the Caddo Parish Teachers Federal Credit Union (CPTFCU). He served with honor and integrity as CEO/Manager/Treasurer of the CPTFCU until his retirement from that position on October 18, 2003.

Mr. Moody was married to the love of his life, Mrs. Estella Moody for 65 years. To this union 2 children were born. Albert M. Moody, Jr. and Tahira (Moody) Abdul-Rahman. They have 6 grandchildren, 7 great-grandchildren, and many beloved infeces and nephews.

Mr. Moody has served as an Educator, Mentor, Role Model, Surrogate Father and Friend to countless individuals. . Mr. Moody was a trailblazer who made a difference in the lives of his family, students, colleagues and community. He will be forever loved and missed by those that
