English Department

The Vernon High School offers a four year program of English designed to prepare students for college as well as for immediate vocations.

The program is based on the belief that education for any vocation or profession depends to a large extent on the students' command of their basic language. Not only are the skills of grammar and composition stressed, but emphasis is also placed upon American and English literature, creative writing, and public speaking.

Business Education


Typing techniques are stressed by Mr. Bobby Conerly. This class of seniors anticipate using these skills in college and in future occupations.
