The royal court was served dinner after the procession.

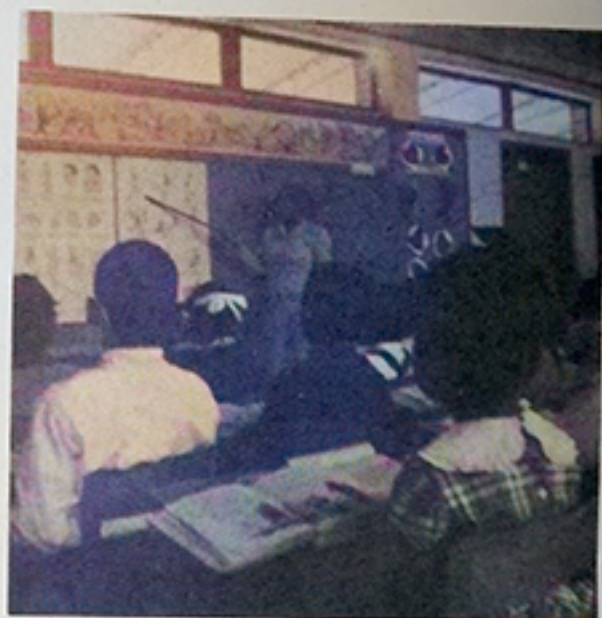

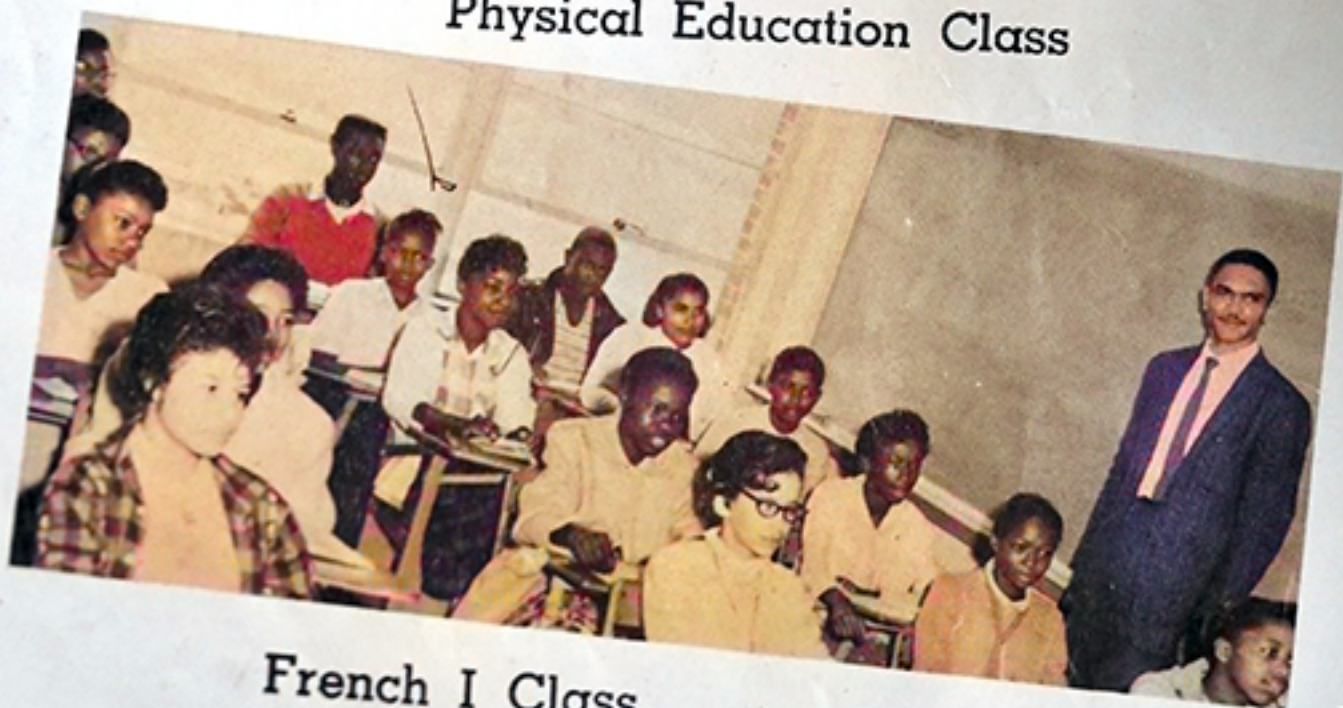

The National Honor Society is planning for its annual initiation ceremony which will take place in the spring.



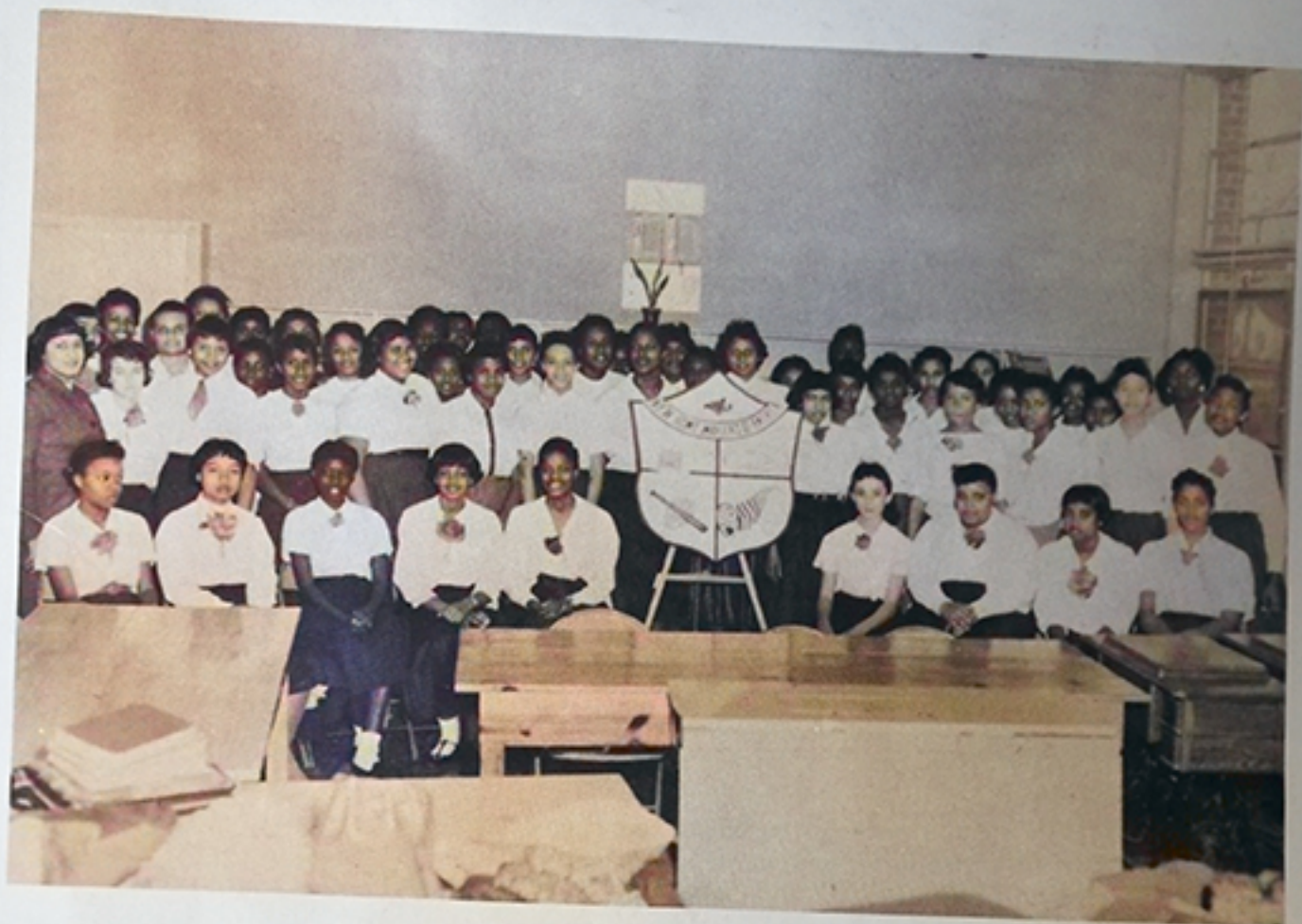

THE GUIDANCE AND SPECIAL SERVICES PROGRAM AND ITS RELATION TO PUPILS CAN BE SUMMARIZED AS FOLLOWS:

The taking of the individual with his *aptitudes, abilities, and attitudes* are always considered when one is relating guidance and special services to the pupils. Many other factors are considered such as: *limitations, interests, opportunities, experiences, and problems.*

Through the basic functions of the Guidance and Special Services Programs, it is much easier and definitely more organized for a worker to: take an *individual inventory*, obtain *occupational and educational information*, give helpful *counsel*, become involved in *exploratory and training opportunities*, insure proper *placement*, *follow-up* the progress, investigate *co-ordination* of home and community agencies, and provide *services* to teachers.

Because of all of the work which has been put into this program, we anticipate much better personal, social, and economic adjustment of the individual.
